



TWIN FALLS AND SALMON TRACT RANK WELL

The high opinion expressed regarding the financial condition of the farmers on the Twin Falls and Salmon tracts, by Chief A. F. TWIN FALLS COUNCIL MAKES WISE DECISION

In deciding to make a survey to secure figures on the cost of construction for a municipal power plant and in pledging to put the matter squarely up to the people the city council took a wise, democratic and patriôtic step. For many years this question has been before the people of Twin Falls. It is wrong to say it was brought before them by agitators, unless the financial forces which later organized the Idaho Power company can be called agitators. When the old Great Shoshone company was sole distributor of electricity here, the company from which the Idaho Power company evolved, got leave to enter the field as a competitor. Many things were promised the people then, and users were led to believe that even with the old company dividing business great extensions could be made. Then the old company was swallowed. The people figured that they had either been used as pawns in a freezeout game, or that the company could do, and would not do, what it promised. For two subsequent elections there was much talk of municipal power and the people were strongly for it. Under the McRoberts administration a new contract, an improvement over a previously proposed one, was entered into between the city and the company. At the same time this city-joined-in the Southern Idaho Light & Power Users' association in a fight to get better rates. Mayor McRoberts and Assistant City Attorney Benoit attended the early meetings. Later Mayor Tucker and City Attorney Davis participated in the meetings and finally. Mayor Hodgin took part and this city is still a party in this battle against what is claimed to be the extortions of the power company.
