

School journeys for pupils, under the care of teachers of the London schools, are valuable from an educational point of view, and the number has greatly increased. They are carefully planned and carried out and last usually from a week to a fortnight.

To determine the general knowledge of students, a psychological test is given every year to the freshman class at Pennsylvania State College. This year they were required to answer 230 questions in 40 minutes. Men students made an average score of 83.9 and women students 77.7. More than 1,000 freshmen took the test.—School Life.

Benefits of the four open-air schools for the physically defective, operated by the London City Council, have been extended to an increasing number of children, and some experiments are in progress to determine how far sunlight treatment can be utilized beneficially.

WHY THE CHILD LABOR AMENDMENT FAILED

BY JAMES D. WHELAN.

Now that it is evident that the child labor amendment if not permanently defeated is at least set back for a considerable time, it may be of interest to consider why a movement which was greeted with so much popular commendation. When "urged during the Wilson administration, failed to receive general support when submitted to the people, or at least to their representatives in the legislatures.

rhe-first reason is the reaction against the unlimited extension of federal powers. The second is the fact that the amendment was different in vital principle from the two statutes enacted under the Wilson administration and later declared unconstitutional by the supreme court. The laws, afterwards mullified, made but a slight extension of federal powers, interfered to no appreciable extent in state affairs-and-then-only-incidentally in the marter of inspection, and appeared to be in logical, if not legal, principle but the application of the regulation of interstate commerce. On the other hand, the amendment gave congress a right of interference in the internal production of states and in the control of the lives of children up to the age of 18 years, that was absolutely unlimited in scope and possibilities. This proposal was put up at a time when the theory of the omnipotence of federal wisdom and power was seriously shaken, as a result of loading down Uncle Sam with regulation of every sort, complicated with the confusion arising from the supposed co-operation resulting from dual responsibility and dual sets of officers of nation and state with concurrent jurisdiction over the same matters. The first reason is the reaction against the unlimited

The writer is convinced that had the amendment sub mitted been limited to permission to congress to constitutionally enact the laws millified by the supreme court, or those of a similar nature, it would have carried. The first of these laws enacted September 1, 1916, "Prohibited in terstate shipment of the products of factories, etc., in which within 30 days prior to the removal of such profugets therefrom children under the age of 14 years had been employed or had been permitted to work." The second laid a tax of 10 per cent on the net profits of any person, etc., operating mines, factories, etc., in which children under 14 years of age, were permitted to work more than eight hours a day.

The first of these acts provided for no penalties by the federal government, beyond preventing the export of articles that did not conform to the law outside the state of their production. It provided for no federal regulation. It would have been effective, for every state would instantly see to it that local regulation would take care of the matter.

The other law, enacted after the first was ruled out, while permitting more interference, would still have lodged no police powers in the federal government beyond those necessary for the collections of the revenue, and practically none would have been required since, as in the other instance, the states would promptly see to it that the constitutional requirement had been met.
