## ACTION ON COVENANT CONFIRMS CONTENTIONS

The fact that the Irish Free State took an independent stand against England at the meeting of the League of Nations council yesterday, and that Austen Chamberlain, in announcing the position of the English foreign office called attention to the fact that each of the colonies, being league members, would announce its own stand shows:

Harry F. Sinclair, so prominently featured in the Tea-pot Dôme oil scandals which resulted in the retirement of Albert Bacon Fall as secretary of the interior, is conspic-tiously in the limelight again because of his determination to hold the Wyoming oil lands which he secured under lease from the governments. The eyes of the country have been turned toward Cheyenne where the first test is being made to determine the firmness of Sinclair's grip on these

public lands.

The case is a comparatively simple one so far as the issues involved are concerned. Sinclair claims the leases were properly executed by the recent secretary of the interior. The government contends, the leases were acquired by fraud and therefore should be annulled. To prove its case the government will endeavor to show that certain sums of money were paid and that the leases were given without public hearing. Mr. Fall will be one of the government's witnesses.

The lands involved in the legal controversy were set aside during the administration of Secretary of the Navy Paniels as an oil base for the navy. They have been subject to revokable lease, however, for their development. When the lands were withdrawn there was considerable sharp criticism of the action of the secretary of the navy in sending troops to the territory to drive out squatters and this has been since intensified when it developed that Sinclair, a multi-millionaire, acquired heavy leases from the secretary of the antipolic and over public lands aroused greater interest than that of the Teapot Dome. The exposure made at Washington during the investigation to be a fighter and, judging from the galaxy of legal lights he has taken with him to Cheyenne, he is going to prove to be just as stubborn a fighter there to hold the oil lands he has under lease.

Cases and exposures of this kind tend to shatter confidence, and it will only be regained by the government taking a firm stand in this case, and do overything within its power to bring about a cancellation of the leases.—Exchange.






