





TOLL BRIDGE PLAN COMING BACK

Those favoring the construction of a toll bridge across the Snake river, and this mothod will probably be followed on the Twin Falls tract, will find encouragement in the following editorial in the chrent issue of the Springfield (Mass.) Republican:

While we are constantly priding ourselves on new developments in transportation and transmission—on the earth, in the air and by wire—we should pause to note the restoration of one ancient idea which modern sentiment uplot a few years ago was steadily relegating further and further into the limbo of discarded things. This idea is the charging of tolls for the privilege of making use of a bridge. Indications are increasing that the toll bridge has come back. The automobile has revived it.

To be sure, the full bridge was not entirely extinct. It was virtually extinct in New England and the north Atlantic states. And New England and the north Atlantic states and New England and the north Atlantic states. Are seeing its revival. The Maine Legislature at the present session is expected to complete plans for a bridge across the Kennebec river at Bath. A part of this structure will be rented by the Maine Central railroad, which will thus be erabled to eliminate the slow and often difficult; it is a transportation of its Bath-Woolwich train ferry. But the bridge-airphway will be open to the public only on the payment of tolls, though probably with an exemption for local users.

Between Philadelphia and Camden, N. J., a monumental bridge is under construction. The New Jersey law authorizing this project clearly contemplates the collection of tolls, and, even though a movement is on foot to have the bridge made a free bridge, there will be no departure from the obligation to the people of the state who woted favorably on a proposal for a \$28,000,000 bond issupporting. The Peekskill highway bridge across the Hudson, opened last Novembor, and built as a private enterprise, is a toll bridge. In addition to these ambitious projects, realized or in process of realization, legislative consideration has been given to no fewer than four plans for constructing toll bridges between New York and New Jersey, one of them across the Hudson at New York and New Jersey, one of them across the Hudson at New York city; and the offiger three crossing the hills, or tidal catuaries; which separate Staten Island from the mainland.

The status of these four-projects is somewhat vague. While the New Jersey legislature has been disposed to regard them favorably, their constitutionality isquestioned on the ground that they lend the credit of the state to an outside agency. As the agency in this question is a public body, the port of New York authority, in which New Jersey shares equal bower with New York, the objection is perhaps more technical than real. But the New York egosidature has not yet acted on the proposals at all. Inasmuch as the Hudson river bridge would involve an expenditure of at least \$86,000,000, it is reasonable to suppose that before the proposal gets very far it will be more severely scrutinized than has yet been the case.
