

#### THE PERENNIAL PEDDLER

All the selling devices and methods originated dur-All the selling devices and methods originated during the modern industrial age have not succeeded in eliminating the peddler, who was probably the first distributor of merchandise, the business nomad. If he does not exist in his old-fashioned guise, he is still with us in the form of the house-to-house canvasser. And he is here to stay, declares Alvin E. Dodd, Manager of the Department of Domestic Distribution of the Chamber of Commerce of the Illated States.

"House to-house canvassing," he said in an address to a national trade organization, "although probably one-of-tice earliest forms of merchandising, is manifested in a riew form which, although of distinctly sporadic and ap-parently accidental character, now is accepted as generic and seemingly of a permagent character. I do not know how many kinds of merchandise are distributed in this manner, but it must amount to many hundreds of separate articles embracing the whole alphabet of small commod-ties and even some larger sizes. The practice received-a serious set-back during the period when the sale of light-ning rods was associated with the utterances of fraud-ulent notes, but this chigma has not attached to the sale of sewing machines in rural communities. A list of several hundred articles sold in this manner has been prepared. including even cemetery lots."

#### FARM PROSPERIT AND SCHOOL SUPPORT

Improved methods of marketing farm products are among the essentials to more liberal school support and consequently to good scools for country children, according to addresses and discussions at the Department of Rural Education which held its annual meeting in Cincinnati, February 23-26. The trend of the three-day discussions centered around the idea of conservation. Thermust be conservation of the products and resources of the farm itself in order that sufficient revenue may be forthcoming to enable the farm family to participate in the world's accumulation of culture as well as in a realization of higher ideals of comfort and happiness. Conservation of the combined resources of the farm-communities which make up the unit of school support is necessary in order that these may be tapped and distributed to the best advantage. Last but not least, there must be conservation of the children's educational interests through a professionally administered school or school system as represented by intelligent centralization of the units of taxation as well as the consolidation of school units.


