WILL AID TWIN FALLS

The demand for 30 men on the steel gang put into the chamber of commerce yesterday has two commend-able features. In the first place it is an assurance of the speedy completion of the road to Wells, and in the second it again illustrates the policy pursued by both the Origon Short Line and the Utah Construction company since work Short Line and the Utah Construction company since work began, namely, to engage as many men as possible from Twin Falls instead of shipping them in from outside points. In the old days when crooked employment agencies flourished, the construction companies in most parts of the country closed their eyes and ears to dishonest practices often carried on between sub-contractors and the imployment agency, with disastrous result to workers and to the demoralization of the laborers living near the point of construction. Most sub-contractors and some employment agencies were honest, but there was always a crooked element that co-operated. The Tegislature of 1915 abolished agencies for pay in Idaho, but those outside the state could still be utilized if the railroad company and the construction company wanted to use them.

TENNESSEE GOES BRYAN

Man wins in Tennessee. There is no monkey in his Man wins in Tennessee. There is no monkey it his making, no upward ascent from humbler stock, no gradual evolution of successive species and no science. By a vote whose numbers pro and con are not as yet reported, the Tennessee legislature has ruled that Darwin was quite wrong and the earth. if not flat, hus at least been inhabited from the start by men like those who now inhabit. A law has been enacted by the legislature

which provides—

That it shall be unlawful for any teacher in any of the universities, normal and all other public Schools of the state which are supported—in whole or in part by the public school funds of the state to teach any theory that denies the story of the Divine creation of man as taught in the Bible, and to teach instead that mun has descended from a lower order of animals."

This law, signed by Gov. Peay, who seizes the occasion to remark that "all men have a natural and indefensible right to worship as they choose." now takes it place upon the statute books, and there are a dozen universities in Tennessee which will find it dangerous to ophebooks, not printed with wood type upon a hand-press. Science outside of Tennessee may smile, and of course whatever Gov. Peay and his colleagues do, men's minds will not stop thinking. Yet this science-smashing down in Tennessee cannot be laughed away as unimportant, signifying nothing. It serves to remind us that education has not yet won its freedom. Free from many of its older shackles, education will fight for its rights in the next generation against the encronchments of political control: snackles, education will light for its rights in the next generation against the necroachments of political control: against meddling makers of the law who are backed by power to cut off public funds. Let those who can look with serenity upon the growth of an ever-increasing authority on the part of popular political assemblies in this country turn to Tennessee and contemplate the opportunities for means sufficient inheritors. ities for more political tinkering with education.-New

The law enacted is not free, from valid criticism: While the theory of the development of the body of man from some unknown ape is at best an hypothesis, it would not necessarily follow that this theory, if advanced only as such, is contrary to the story of creation as taught in the Bible. Man is "dust and unto dust he returns," and so do all physical bodies, and the dust, or as some render it, bithulithic, from which the body of man was created might have gone through many mutations before it was perfected and before God blew into man the breath of which made him a living soul, spiritually, according to some. In assuming a necessary contradiction between this possible hypothesis and the meaning of scriptures the Tennessee law-makers assume an ancalled for burden of proof.

But so-called science which too often passes for the real article is, after all to blame. The looseness of language of the Tennessee statute is less striking than the looseness of reasoning by certain writers who assume an air of authority and are held to be authorities by many who hate the task of actually thinking. Blightly and admittedly without evidence pseudo historians like Van Loon, and, (do not get horrified), H. G. Wells, build up the most far-fetched conclusions and oponly, or with subtle sarcasm, scoff at the veracity of Holy Writ, and deny the possibility of reconciliation between science and the Bible. And geologists, with pre-conceived theories proceed to teach psychology, which is not their province, and assume that the intellectual in man is itself an evolution from the impulsive reaction of the earth-worm. Presuming flot teach what they clearly know nothing about, they calmly assume that religion and morality develop in the same way. And so-called text-books by such writers do get into schools.

It is against this sort of alleged science and usendehistory that the legislature of Tennessee was palpably aiming its law. Its instinct was sound if its methods were crude. The World is leveling its criticisms largely at the wrong persons; and certainly at the wrong angle, even where the content of the property many presents.


