



RAILROAD TALK WEST OF BUHL RESUMED

If the Oregon Short Line builds from Buhl to Glenns Ferry as indicated in the news dispatches last week, it will mean that Buhl will be on the main line as much as Boise is.

Arguments before the interstate commerce commission last week disclosed that with the completion of the Rogerson-Wells cut-off and the extension of the line from Buhl to Glenns Ferry, that there would not be any further need of railroad building in southern Idaho. Which is a fact.

The completion of this line will mean that all of the towns on the Minidoka branch will have the long-looked for outlet to the west and the Pacific coast.

The Washington dispatches indicate the first of anything like serious official intention to build the extension

thing like serious official intention to build the extension and were made public because another line was asked for in eastern Oregon.—Buhl Herald.

Similar statements were made in a hearing before the public utilities commission recently in Boise, by railroad attorneys, and published at the time in the Times. The signs all point in the same direction. Recent surveys have been made. E. J. Hunt & Son, leading contractors, have purchased the old Maxwell ranch at Peavey and the general attitude of the company points that way. Swift & company have come in here on a large scale and undoubtedly with information in regard to the future.

Over two years ago Chief Engineer W. R. Armstrong said here: "If the Idaho Central is not built we will build to Wells and later will extend the line west."

Judges, juries and officers of the law can do little enough unless they are sustained and upheld by religious and ethical training and by sound minded nation.

The equal and speedy admiristration of justice, without fear or favor, is a notable ally of social safety and strength.

Maudlin sympathy with artful and habitual offenders

should be suppressed.

The private possession of deadly weapons should be forbidden, and their manufacture made a government

These measures are far-reaching and involve some serious problems. But the disgraceful iniquities they are intended to counteract are far more extensive and serious and the need is imperative.

The man of woman who in things great or small endeavors in any way to evade the law, contributes to the crime wave. It gets its volume and its crimson crest of murder from the general lassitude about law and the equally general practice of cheating it a little. Too many who pride themselves on their respectability are guilty under this count.

Therefore let every American man and woman cultivate faithful obedience and observance of all moral and civic law. Let fathers and mothers become the priests and priestesses of their own households.

Such conduct on our part in conjunction with the measures I have suggested above, cannot fail to bring about an immediate decrease in the prevalence of crime and will ultimately result in its suppression.

Every man and woman may thus personally aid in this great national task. Your faithful observance of all law will be a fitting crown to-your wisdom and your love for this fair land of ours.


