Supreme Court Has Reversed Decision and Lodge Must Pay

WASHINGTON, April 13.—A peculiar instance of a reversal of the Supreme Court decision was announced today when the Supreme Court reversed its decision in the case of the National Supreme Court decision requiring the Federal Woodmen of America, a fraternal society incorporated in Illinois to pay \$20,000 under a death benefit certificate to Jennie Vail Meyer.

Mrs. Meyer's husband, a member of the lodge, has been missing for more than seven years and therefore under the laws of Nebraska is legally dead. The lodge refused to pay the money, pointing to a clause in its by-laws providing that "no person is presumed dead, and shall not be recognized as such, until a certificate of death is received from a physician."

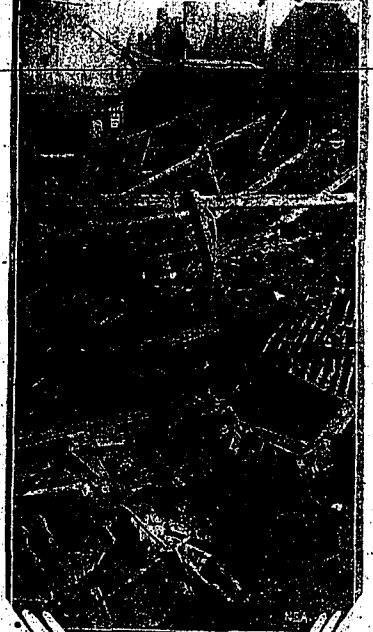

RIGHT TO PRINT INCOME TAX IS UP TO COURT

Supreme Court of U. S. Will Decide Two Great Issues; First, Has President Right to Remove Appointees, and Right to Public Tax Returns.

WASHINGTON, April 13.—The United States supreme court today was called upon by lay down its uncertainty as to the right of the press to print information of the rights of free speech and freedom of the press as guaranteed in the first amendment to the constitution.

A separate brief filed by Newton H. Baker, former secretary of war, as counsel for the Baltimore Post-Crisis-Howard newspaper, and by Senator James A. Reed, Missouri democrat, counsel for the Kansas City Journal-Post—the two papers being prosecuted by the government for alleged illegal publication of income tax returns, the contention was made that these rights are being abridged.

The freedom of the press guaranteed by the first amendment consists of the right to print, to publish, to print whatever anyone may lawfully say to everyone," Baker said.

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 13.—Two major issues were brought before the United States supreme court today for argument—the right of the president to remove from office his own or the predecessor's appointees, and the right of newspapers to print information of tax returns furnished by the last revenue law.

Both cases are held to be of fundamental importance and a distinguished array of legal counsel will be heard on both sides.

The case involving the presidential power was brought by President Wilson, 1919-1921, against the state of New York, which had sued the court on the ground that his removal of a justice was unconstitutional.
