## NEW RESOURCES COMING TO LIGHT IN IDAHO

**Marble.** Specimen of the marble recently discovered by James McPherson, near Arco and sent by him to Salt Lake, have made such a favorable impression on a marble firm of that city that a carload has been ordered at once.

**Platinum.** According to advices received in Lewiston, the upper Snake River mining region has platinum ores of a richness that promises to bring the district into immediate prominence. Samples of ore on which the platinum worth \$164 as well as gold and silver worth about \$76 to the ton.


