WON HINDENBURG'S ELECTION

Hindenburg's election is another example of the explosion of extreme ultra-nationalism that has manifested itself in all countries since the war. Starting with the khaki election in England in 1918, and the American election of 1920, it has at one time or another affected all countries. Italy, after an extreme socialistic regime went to fascism. France elected Poincare, a member of the Right. Smaller nations took the same tack. Germany, long suppressed by fears, and under semi-socialistic domination, now, goes militaristic and reactionary. The result is serious and may be disastrous. There is hope, however, in the fact that the conditions in most countries appear transitory. France abandoned Poincare. England elected an extreme labor government, though it has since renudiated it. Italy shows signs of rejecting the Fascist. For the moment, however, militarism is in the saddle. France will gather to herself in defense all the rest of Europe except Russin, which is the real danger spot. Perhaps Lloyd George is as much to hame as anybody. In the war excitement he joined with his natural political enemies to hold a snap election. He won, but in winning tied himself in a way that prevented him from giving full support to Wilson at Versailles. Later when his reactionary allies broke loose, he found himself simply, the first lieutenant of a third party. Had I loyd George remitted with Asquith earlier and backed Wilson to the fullest extecht, in Paris, he could probably have carried England at an election later, and paved the way for world usage. There is hope that the victory of Hindenburg shall prove a temporary flurry and that the world will think twice before plunging into war. The people of the world do not want war.
