ANOTHER JEFFERSON DAY SOON

BY JAMES D. AVHELAN.

This is the 122nd anniversary of the day on which the Louisiana purchase-became a fact, subject only to the approval and ratification of the governments of America and France, for on May 2, the English copy of the treaty was signed by the representatives of the two nations. By this agreement the United States obtained a territory of 1,171,931 square miles, more than the total area, of the original 13 states combined. For this vast area the total sum of \$15,000,000 was paid, one-quarter to Americans holding claims against France and the balance to France in the precent bonds. The signatures were placed to the French copy April 30, 1803, which date it written into the treaty. It was to be signed both in French and English and the final act took place May 2.

Livingston and Monroe Signed for America, and Marbols signed for France, but the real actors in the case were President Thomas Jefferson and Napoleon Bonaparte. The transaction is a tribute to the profound statesmanship of these great men; one the greatest representative of democracy in the widest sense of the term; the other the personification of despotism. Each served his country and his cause by what he did.




