U. S. MAP AND THE IDAHO POWER

That map the United States government is making reminds one of the valuation of the Idaho Power company. That map the United States government is making reminds one of the valuation of the Idaho Power company. It was 45 years ago the government started out on its project of preparing a map—or set of maps—which would show the thopography of every part of this country—roads, railroads, cities, farms and all. During 45 years the work has progressed, but no sooner is part of it done and exhibited than it is at once apparent that the country has gone ahead and left, the map behind. The map may show Kane county, Illinois, as it was in 1900, but things are very different in 1925, says the Statesman.

The power company valuation is similar in this respect. It was started in 1919. Through 1920 and 1921 and 1922 and 1923 it was being completed and discussed in utilities commission hearings and fought over. And when finally a figure was fixed upon, all the public had was the valuation of the power company's property "as of December 31, 1919." The company's business had grown with the country. The valuation didn't fit, at all, so there had to be more wrangling over additions and the like. The thing is still in the courts.

A small army of topographers, working on the big map of the United States, will find that roads have changed, cities have moved, farms have disappeared or been cut into many farms or consolidated into estates of large area. Young Reynolds and Johnson have it still to learn.
