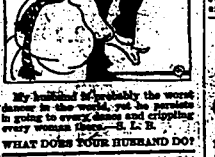

From the number of inquiries which have been coming into this city it would indicate that the time is not very far distant when Twin Falls would be on the air mail line. The government has sent letters asking for information and the postal department is considering us for stopover point on air mail to the northwest.

That the Twin Falls tract is coming to the front is shown in the demand for bonds in this section of the state. We are assured that the "Rim to Rim Bridge Bonds" will find a ready market among the financiers of the East and this is certainly an encouraging sign for the people of southern Idaho. Money seems plentiful from many other places besides our local cash which is being offered freely for good security with long time loans.

The year 1924 witnessed the killing of 19,000 human beings by automobiles in the United States. This red record should arouse the drivers of such machines to a full sense of their responsibility. It should also cause motorists to keep close watch when crossing streets or strolling along the highways constantly traveled by automobiles. Finally, the same figures should force parents to keep better watch over their children. The number of automobiles in daily use in the United States is constantly increasing and unless extraordinary precautions are taken the number of accidents, fatal or otherwise, will likewise increase. Automobile accidents have been numerous in Salt Lake of late. Evidently the figures given above should be taken to heart by residents of this city as well as elsewhere.

NEW SHIP SUBSIDY BILL

In his plan for granting a bonus to sailors on American ships, which it is proposed to sell to private owners, Chairman O'Connor, of the shipping board, carries the doctrine of the sort of high protection advocated by his party to its logical conclusion. This theory is that a tariff is put on an article, which the owner receives on the theory that he turns it over in higher value to his workers. Chairman O'Connor seems to doubt the efficiency of this theory and instead of giving the subsidy to the ship owners, he wants to give it directly to the worker. He seems to have fear, based on the history of other great interests, that it will not get through to the worker. The chairman indicates the fact that the protective system is a weight on the shipping industry. "If on the protected side of our tariff wall, an American is going into business on the ocean he has got to have help from the United States treasury," he declares.

The tariff necessarily operates unevenly. Some are bound to get more practical benefit from it than others. The American Farm Bureau figures that, giving every agricultural schedule the benefit of every reasonable assumption in its favor, the farmers lose more than \$300,000,000 annually as a result of the operation of the system. The next move, which would be as logical as the one suggested by O'Connor, should be to give farm laborers a bonus out of the treasury in order to help out the agriculturists. There is a net loss in any system which consists of a number of schedules, robbing Peter to pay Paul, robbing Paul to pay James, and robbing James to pay John (and John to pay Peter. Somebody will get the big end of the rakeoff at the expense of others and the organized trusts can do that in American industry, and do so.

"I am again making the matter up with the second assistant postmaster inasmuch as will communicate further with you."

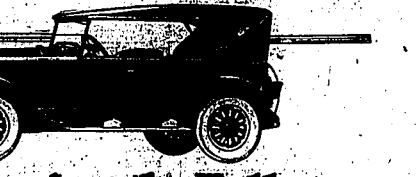
