

FARM SITUATION BEST IN FIVE YEARS

The general agricultural situation in the United States is the most cheerful in five years, plowing and planting on May 1st, are fully two weeks ahead of the usual seasonal condition, crop acreage will be increased, better prices are being received for wheat, hogs, dairy and poultry products, prospects are bright for higher beef cattle prices and fewer pigs have been farrowed this spring, according to the new Sears-Roebuck Agricultural Foundation Index, just issued from an exhaustive analysis of reports from 1512 field observers throughout the nation. These 1512 observers, taking 100 as normal, considered errop conditions, prices received for agricultural products, a prices praid for commodities the farmer buys, price prospects and the general outlook for agriculture. On this basis they found that the May 1st index of farm conditions is 88.6.1 The observers' reports indicate that the American farmer is slowly but surely beating back to normalcy.
