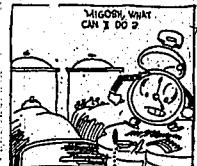

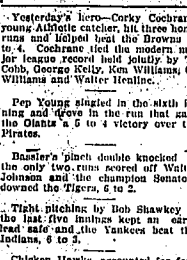

That the schools of the country are using intelligence and achievement tests with definite purposes in view is set forth in City School Leaflet No. 20, of the Department of the Interior, Bureau of Education. Of 215 cities reporting to the bureau, 64 per cent are using intelligence tests to classify pupils in the elementary schools and 62 per cent to supplement teachers' estimates of the pupils' ability. These cities report about 20 uses that are made of the intelligence tests, including, in addition to those named, diagnoses of causes of failures, guidance in the selection of high school courses, determining the number of courses to be carried at one time by high school pupils, extra promotions, etc.

Twin Falls is not selling her scenic wonders to the states and the tourists that come this way as we should by any means. If California had one-tenth of these wonders such as the Shoshone Falls, the Hansen bridge, the Twin Falls or Blue Lakes springs this fact would be blazed across the sky in letters of gold so that the whole world might know what was to be seen in this great state. But we sit by and think people should search for our scenic wonders much as the old prospector searches for gold nuggets. Let's each of us do more to spread the news and at least place a marker large enough so that the passing traveler will know that we have something worth while to see in this great Empire of the West. Some of our people cannot tell a stranger the best and shortest method of reaching these scenic points. The falls were never so wonderful as they are this spring and yet we are not sending the message forth to many in our own immediate vicinity that would come to see them again if they only knew. What will you do as a volunteer?

The commencement address last evening before the graduates of the Twin Falls high school was remarkable for its breadth of experience and for the inspiration which it offered to the young life for service. When the speaker urged that our young people needed most of all "A clear definition of life and its relation to the world," he uttered a mighty truth which has been the great need of the world for a generation or more. In many of our great political and labor disputes the paramount issue is a lack of "clear definition" of terms. If a clear understanding is had by both parties to the dispute then their differences begin to fade into thin air. Rev. Carver gave some clear ringing notes of advice to young people and the class of 1926 will do well to think long upon his words. When he said, "Your sin and mine is really the difference between what our lives are and what they might have been," he uttered a mighty truth. The speaker cited many of the leading characters of history and pointed out their strength and weakness and related these to the present day needs of the class in a striking fashion. His closing plea was for faith in ourselves and a purpose likened unto that of Daniel-of-old.

ONLY HALF OF CITIZENS VOTE

In a bulletin recently issued by the Bureau of Education of the Interior Department we read, "The United States is prosperous . . . but . . . only half of our eligible voters actually vote even at the presidential elections; five millions of our people over 10 years of age are illiterate; ten millions of our children of school age are not attending school; we spend more for tobacco, cosmetics, and chewing gum than we do for education; half of our young men were found physically unfit for unlimited military service; our wage earners lose wages amounting to over two billion dollars a year because of preventable sickness; in 1870 there was one divorce for every 18 marriages; last year there was one divorce for every eight marriages."

These are some of the problems confronting the State. It needs to help more of its people to become good citizens. The fewer the number of ill and privations of life, and the greater the happiness of humanity, the nearer we approach the social ideal. A progressive school is a miniature of society. Not only is its structure much the same but it carries on many of the same activities. It seeks to promote the welfare of the pupils through the best methods in use in society.

What are some of the school tasks confronting 730,000 teachers? The school should give every child an equal opportunity to develop fully his initiative and ability. It should assure to him healthful conditions for mind and body. It should imbue him with the principles of personal honesty and a strong sense of his obligations to his family, his community, and his nation. It should give him the education and training necessary to support himself and to bear his just share in maintaining a community with high American ideals. It should develop his capacity for the wholesome use of leisure time. It should inculcate a broad and understanding patriotism which inspires our country's highest good.

Saul, like every one who is really converted, begins to tell of the newly found Savior. As soon as he is given the power to testify others. His message concerned the duty of Christ. His preaching led to the conversion of thousands. "He is the Son of God."

3. How Saul Preached Christ in Damascus (v. 20).

4. The Jews Confounded (v. 22).

Saul retired into Arabia for three years. During this time he was taught the full truth of his ministry (Gal. 1:17-20). Saul increased in spiritual strength and confounded the Jews, proving that Jesus was not only the Son of God, but their Messiah.

5. Saul Escapes From the Jews (v. 23-24).

Saul fled to Damascus with much will that the Jews could not answer him. Finding that the argument was against them, the Jews took counsel. They might destroy him. So they went there upon killing him that Saul, watching the action of the city, might think that they had killed him. When this became known to the disciples they let him down at night in a basket by the wall.

6. Saul Visits Jerusalem (v. 25-26).

This journey to Jerusalem was in contrast with the one from Jerusalem to Damascus. The one was as a leader of an important expedition under the authority of the Jewish officers with the prospect of a place of distinction in the council of the Jewish nation. Now he is an outcast, disowned by his countrymen and fleeing for his life. These are the outward circumstances, but he knows the fellowship of the Lord Jesus whom he once hated.

7. Suspected by the Disciples (v. 27).

The believers at Jerusalem had not heard fully about Saul's conversion. They knew nothing of his sojourn in Arabia, and his preaching in Damascus after his return. Therefore they suspected him as a spy. "Part of the penalty of evangelizing is the difficulty of obtaining in the good opinion of honorable men."

8. Barnabas' Confidence in Saul (v. 28).

Harnabas was a man filled with the Holy Spirit (Acts 11:24) and therefore he discerns the reality of Saul's conversion. He was in reality a "son of consolation" and here showed his kind spirit.

9. Saul in Fellowship With the Disciples (v. 29).

10. He was not content merely to visit with the brethren. He took boldly in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ.

11. Saul Sent to Tarsus (v. 30).

A conspiracy similar to that one at Damascus was formed against Saul. When the brethren knew of it they sent him to Tarsus. Saul's life was in danger everywhere except among the Gentiles. He now is back to the place of his birth. The first and best place for one's testimony is in his home. Saul's conversion was typical of the conversion of the Jewish nation. The eyes will be opened to the personal revelation of Jesus Christ to them, and when they accept Him as their Savior and Messiah, they will go forth as witnesses to the Gentiles.

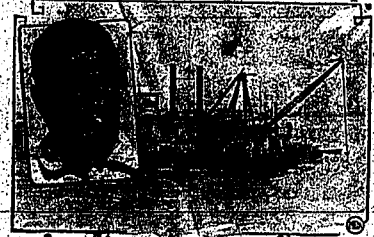

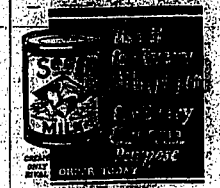
