The parking plan of G. H. Self which will help re-lieve the auto congestion on Main avenue and Shoshone street and will furnish safe means of guarding against auto thieves at a reasonable price will fill a growing need in this city. It is a solution for one phase of the traffic trouble that has been successfully tried in larger cities.

Wireless apparatus in public schools for the use of parents and citizens' associations will be permitted by the New South Wales Minister for Education after successful experiments. It is expected that such a course will bring isolated country centers in touch with Sydney, and the country schools will thus become important social centers especially in the evenings.

Sports which seem to have the greatest value in a high school are walking, volley ball, playground baseball, tennis, swimming, dancing, soccer, jumping, basketball, and the short races. These are also much the cheapest to provide and they require the least space. They should be furnished in all school systems. This statement is made by Dr. Henry S. Curtis, State director of hygiene and physical education for Missouri, in a study of the relative value of physical activities in high school in School Life, a publication of the Interior Department, Bureau of Education. Doctor Curtis' conclusion is that walking represents probably nine-tentis of all the physical energy most of us develop, outside of the vital processes themselves. It is the only activity that most of us continue in after life. Every high school should have a walker's guide and develop a series of 20 to 30 walks of from five to 20 miles each.

The Afghan Embassy an Moscow recently held a celbiration in honor of the seventh anniversary of Afghanistan's independence. Russia was the first large power
to recognize Afghanistan's claim to independence, and in
1920 the Afghan Maneer, Amanullah Khan, addressed a
glowing letter to Lenine, whom he characterized as a benefactor-of-humanity-and the Eastern-peoples. After the
conclusion of a treaty between England and Afghanistan,
there was a certain cooling off in Soviet-Afghan relations.
The former Ameer of Bokhara, driven into exile by the,
Soviet revolution in his own country, found asylum in
Afghanistan, and, although the Ameer himself apparently
maintained a correct position, certain Afghan tribal leaders are believed to have been implicated in the native uprising against the Soviet government in Turkeston and
Bokhara which took place in 1922. As this uprising subsided, however, the Soviet-Afghan relations became more
normal and at the present time the two governments are
discussing the possibilities of a commercial treaty.

IDAHO'S EJPORTS AMOUNT TO NEARLY \$2,000 IN

Leading its neighbor states, Utah and Nevada, in the 1924 race for foreign markets, Idaho had merchandise exports valued at \$1,881,420, according to statistics, just released by the department of commerce. Though North Dakota is forty-sixth place in the standing of the various states and just ahead of Idaho in the list, had foreign shipments of-slightly over \$800,000 in excess of Idaho's showing for the year. Alaska, runner-up to Idaho, finished health of the United States for the year ending December 31, 1924; amoanted to \$4,498,151,936.

Idaho's exports were so diversified that the only one

Idaho's exports were so diversified that the only one appearing on the classified list of importance was that of ores, metals and manufactures thereof. Shipments of this item amounted to \$238,190. The others were of minor amounts.

Exports amounting to over \$100,000,000 for the year were attained by eleven states of the 52 states and regions included in the tabulation. They were Texas, with figures of \$787,218,927; New York, \$731 593,502; Pennsylvania, \$283,684,210; New Jersey, \$223,921,270; California, \$224,684,210; New Jersey, \$223,921,264; Louisinian, \$222,847,224; Michigan, \$177,876,654; Virginia, \$150,198,225, Ohio, \$133,559,362; and Massachusetts. With merchandise valuations of \$111,418,430. Minnesota, with shipments valued at \$99,880,490, was just outside the first eleven states, while Nevada, with exports amounting to but \$233,413, brought up the rear of the entire list.

This is the first time in the history of government trade statistics, according to Dr. Julius Klein, director of the bureau of foreign and domestic commerce, under whose charge the figures were compiled, that an attempt has been made to show the relative yearly standing of the different states and regions of the Union in the never-endifigures gave only the port from which shipments were cleared. 




