AUTO RACER PINNED UNDER CAR IN TRYOUT

Miller Special Driven at Speed of More Than 100 Miles an Hour, Turns Driver Under Car, Five Sweeps Race Starts Tomorrow.

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., May 28.—L. L. Corum, riding one of Ralph De Palma's Miller Specials, had a narrow escape from a fatal death today at the first section of the season at the Indianapolis motor speedway.

Driving at a speed of more than 100 miles an hour, Corum ran control of his car when it skidded on a turn. The car crashed into a concrete retaining wall, and was so badly damaged it will be out of the race tomorrow. Corum cringed under the wrecked car.

FISHING TIME OPENS HERE NEXT MONDAY

Rules for Season Are Set Forth by Department for Benefit of Sportsmen of the County; Rock Creek Remains Closed Above Forks; Game Members of Finny Tribe Have Much Protection.

With the opening Monday of the fishing season for game fish, except for bass which is forbidden during June, rules and regulations are summarized from the statutes by Game Warden John T. Saltberry as follows:

Salmon, mountain herring or white fish may be taken with a dip net for local consumption where found in sufficient quantity to supply the demand provided that such catching shall be done under the supervision of the fish and game department in accordance with the terms of a permit.

Fishing with hook and line is lawful except for bass in June. Fishing is forbidden within 300 feet of a dam or weir on the lower side in any stream.

Fishing in Rock Creek above the forks, about June 10 to 15, is forbidden. Rock Creek is forbidden; the Rock Creek being open. Fishing near the Cedar Creek bridge is prohibited.

Small trout and black lake under six inches in length are protected, and the same applies to the bowfin and the haddock to be set for its purpose.

Carrying on shoreback or the bank of any animal is forbidden. Carp suckers or chub may be used for bait, but it is forbidden to use or release any of these into the public waters of the state except under the direction of the state department.

Pollution of streams is forbidden. Limit of catch. It shall be unlawful for any person to catch from the public waters more than 15 pounds and one fish, of trout, bass, catfish, grayling, perch or sunfish in any one day or to have in his possession more than 20 pounds and one fish of these fish.

Persons taking these fish are prohibited so taken at any one time, or to have more than 20 pounds of these fish dried in his possession at any one time except as provided for Bear Lake trout, in computing the number of pounds of fish which any person may catch or have in his possession under the provision of this chapter, the fish shall be weighed as they are taken with the heads on.

If the heads have been removed from the fish, the weight shall be lawful for any person to have in his possession more than 12 pounds of fish more than 20 trout, bass, catfish, grayling, perch or sunfish in any one day, or to have in his possession more than 20 pounds of these fish at any one time.

A great deal of confusion has arisen over the construction of the regular sliding, with the extra sliding.

In the meantime several companies are getting out a lot of extra material to slipping it to market.
