

# OREGON LAW CONTRARY TO CONSTITUTION

Supreme Court of U. S. Declared Oregon School Law Unconstitutional. State Cannot Abolish Parochial Schools Is Unanimous Decision of Court.

WASHINGTON, D. C., June 1.—A state cannot abolish private and parochial schools, the United States supreme court ruled today. The high court held the Oregon public school law which did away with such schools by requiring all children between the ages of 8 and 16 to attend public schools was unconstitutional. Justice McFadden read the decision of the court which was unanimous.

"We are of the opinion that this law if enforced would destroy private schools with which the state has no business," said Justice McFadden. "We think that the state interferes unlawfully with the right of parents to regulate the education of their children."

"The child is not a mere creature of the state," said Justice McFadden. "It is an Oregon federal court decision giving two schools an injunction restraining the state officers from enforcing the law in September, 1924, when it was scheduled to go into effect, was affirmed. The law, adopted in a general state election under the initiative in November, 1922, affected about 12,000 children now in private and church schools."

Governor W. M. Pierce, Attorney General Isaac H. Van Winkle and Attorney General Meyer of Multnomah county were named in the injunction suit to the supreme court. It was a constitutional matter, of the police power of the state.

# CHINESE SOLDIERS MUTINY AND KILL MOST OF OFFICERS

More Than 600 Men Turn on Officers and Kill Most of Them.

LONDON, June 1.—Six hundred Chinese soldiers at the Huang Chueh arsenal in South China mutinied and killed the majority of their officers, according to a delayed dispatch from Hong Kong to the Central News.

Sixty of the mutineers later were arrested and put to death, the dispatch said.

Failure to pay the soldiers was given as the cause of the mutiny. The mutineers said that the soldiers shot most of the officers as they slept and then pillaged the barracks. These officers, remaining alive except to the Portuguese colony of Macao, ten miles distant and later with the aid of the Portuguese authorities, rounded up sixty mutineers whom they turned over to the Chinese army. Executions followed immediately.

# GOD OR GORILLA IS CAUSE OF CHURCH FUNDAMENTALISTS

Anti-evolutionists in 11 States Have Arisen in a Cry "Down With Darwinism" and "Up With the Bible."

NEW YORK, June 1.—Aroused by what they call as "mouney business," anti-evolutionists in 11 states have taken to the cry of "Down With Darwinism" and "Up With the Bible." In some form or another, they claim that the biblical story of Adam and Eve is a fairy tale.

With Dayton, Tenn., where a new state evolution law is being tested, as the storm center, a tremendous wave of fundamentalism is sweeping the country, a nation wide survey by the United Press shows.

Legislators, school boards, college trustees, prominent attorneys, free-thinkers, even all sorts of men have drawn into the controversy, with the anti-evolutionists crying "Down With Darwinism" and the opposition crying "Up With the Bible."

Anti-evolutionists in Southwest, where the fundamentalists needed only the impetus of the J. T. Scopes case to cause them to disengage themselves.

The present anti-evolution movement centered largely in the south, where the survey shows, states in which anti-evolutionists are active are in progress, include, besides Tennessee, North Carolina, Florida, Texas, Georgia, Alabama, Mississippi, Illinois, Minnesota, Oregon, Arkansas, Iowa, West Virginia and North Dakota.

Teaching of evolution has been prohibited for two years in Oklahoma. At the same time, the state of Texas has passed a law forbidding the teaching of evolution in the University of Texas. In that state and in Kentucky, the lower houses of the legislatures passed anti-evolution bills that the upper houses refused to pass.

Recently the Baptists of Kentucky voted to continue to fund a school where evolution was taught. The Florida legislature has passed a resolution requesting school boards not to employ instructors who taught Darwinism. In that state a bill has been introduced which would make such instruction unlawful.

# VICE-PRESIDENT MARSHALL DIES SUDDENLY IN HOTEL



# MARSHALL WAS RUNNING MATE OF W. WILSON

Former War Vice-President Passed Away While Reading His Bible This Morning in Washington Hotel Where He Was Resting After Lecture Tour.

WASHINGTON, D. C., June 1.—Former Vice President "Boss" Marshall died at his hotel here today at 9:30 a. m. Marshall, believed to be convalescing from nervous exhaustion and a cold which prostrated him on his arrival here last Tuesday, died without warning from a sudden heart attack.

Marshall was sitting up in bed reading the Bible when he died. Only his nurse was present. Mrs. Marshall was in an adjoining room. The incident came here to rest following a lengthy speaking tour in the middle west.

Marshall was transported to Marion, Ind., for burial in the graveyard where his mother and father had been buried. However, he had not yet been buried.

Marshall was vice-president from 1913 to 1921, during both Wilson and Taft administrations. He had spent a recent night, according to those with him and apparently was well on the way to recovery from the illness which compelled him to remain in his hotel room from March 25 to June 1.

As he was resting in bed this morning, however, his heart gave out and he died without a word.

Marshall was born in New Hampshire, Ind., on March 14, 1854.

After graduation from Wabash college in 1877 he started the practice of law at Columbus, Ind. He was a political power of major importance, was that of governor of Indiana to which he was elected in 1908 and which he held for four years, 1909-1913.

He was nominated vice president at the Indiana democratic national convention in 1912 on the ticket with Woodrow Wilson and re-nominated and re-elected in 1916. Following his retirement to private life in 1921, he was appointed by President Harding as a member of the United States commission.

He was Popular Preaching Officer. As a preaching officer of the anti-slavery movement, he was one of the most popular in the history of that body. His impartiality was never questioned and his ready wit brought out what otherwise would have been a dreary proceedings. He had a host of friends on both sides of the chasm and the esteem in which he was held was evidenced by the presentation to him of a huge loving cup of gold, half of both republicans and democrats, as a mark of respect to the then Vice-President, Calvin Coolidge in 1921.

President Harding named his chief Woodrow Wilson, by just short of fifteen months, he was 71 years of age.

Arrangements tentatively agreed on call for funeral services at the hotel where Marshall died before his burial.

# MEMORIAL CEREMONY IS SOLEMN

**Largest Celebration in History of City Is Successfully Carried Out Saturday; Mayor Ashton Tells of Contribution of Pioneers to the Nation; Cemetery Is Beautiful with Decorations**

How the foresight and vision of Jefferson in following up the acquisition of the Louisiana purchase by the sending of the Lewis and Clark expedition to connect with the settlements of the pioneers on the Columbia and laid the foundation for securing the empire of the northwest was told in the address Saturday by Mayor E. L. Ashton at what was the largest and most successful memorial celebration in the history of this city. The fruits of the Lewis and Clark expedition were gained when set forth in 1804 and later years passed over the Old Oregon trail by Twin Falls and made secure this great addition to the American nation.

Declared here in later years, the sons and daughters of the north and the south met to build up the country and to unite support the nation in its war with Spain and in its struggle to make the world safe for democracy.

Brief address of Commander Earl Munyon of Twin Falls Legion following the reading by him of the Lincoln Gettysburg address and the prayer of Rev. H. G. Humphrey, pastor of the Methodist church, and tolerance, harmonized with the sentiment of the orator of the day and will be the equal service and the entire program.

In the morning wreaths were placed by the boys scouts on the memorial monument erected in the court house yard by the Daughters of the American Revolution and also on

this monument, the tablet in the high school and the cross in the cemetery by the American Legion, the Legion Auxiliary and the War Mothers.

Trended by Capt. P. W. McCook as marshal of the day, who was followed by the Twin Falls band, the parade moved out promptly. Next in line came the G. A. R. members in auto, followed by the American Legion, then the Spanish-American War Veterans. After these marched the Henry V. Walling and Dan McCook circles of the Legion of the United States. The parade was headed by the Sons of Veterans, Company C, Two Hundredth Infantry, the Twin Falls Boy Scouts and Campfire Girls troop and the uniformed drill team of the Modern Woodmen of America. The life and death corps added martial music to the procession.

Following the invocation by Rev. Mr. Humphrey, the G. A. R. ritualistic was read impressively by Commander J. D. Smith of the Dan McCook post, Commander Earl Munyon of the Legion then read effectively the Lincoln Gettysburg speech and supplemented it with a brief and touching declaration that the legion would continue and perpetuate the work of the Grand Army of the Republic. James S. Hill, Meritt G. Bailey, L. L. Patrick and J. B. Whelan constituted a quartet which finished two patriotic selections.

Three Wreaths Placed. Wreaths were placed on the monument for War Mothers by Mrs. David Brown, for the American Legion Women's auxiliary by Mrs. O. H. Kregel and for the American Legion post by Mrs. Munyon. Captain C. H. Kregel, former post commander, and Wilton Peck, former legion district commander, served as escorts.

A firing squad composed of members of Company G, under command of Lieut. Wilbur Howberry, fired the salute. Jack Thorpe, formerly leader of the 148th artillery regimental band, in service overseas, sounded "last" salute.

Conquest of the Northwest. Mayor Ashton told of the con-

quest of the northwest and its effect on our national destiny. The Russian, French and English had sailed up and down the Pacific coast until 1792, he said, to substantiate without passing over the Columbia river bar, which Captain Gray barely crossed. As soon as Jefferson secured Louisiana, he conceived the idea that by extending investigation west he could connect up with this conquest of discovery by the intrepid Robert Captain and in this way acquire a new empire. With this in view the Lewis and Clark expedition was fitted out. Later great reluctance was shown by congress and even antagonism developed toward acquiring this country. Webster wanted to trade our claims for fishery rights and Calhoun, fearing extension of free territory, opposed its development.

English Are Active. In the meantime the Hudson Bay company extended its influence into the northwest and under Mackenzie established a depot. Efforts to offset the work of the company among the Indians were made unavailing.
