

AMERICAN CONSUL IS MISREPRESENTED

U. S. Acting Consul Govern in Italy Clubbed Into Unconsciousness. According to London Report for Failing to Salute Fascist.

LONDON, June 3.—Because he allegedly failed to salute fascists at Leghorn, Italy, Acting American Consul Franklin Owen of that city has been asked to be taken to a hospital according to private letters received today in foreign consular circles.

Owen, who is related to a wealthy Philadelphia family, was clubbed into unconsciousness and lying in the street until police recognized him and sent him to a hospital, the letter said.

The article added that the attack was made by a group of "fascist railway military" from near Rome attending a "fascist anniversary celebration at Leghorn, May 24.

PRESIDENT DECLARES MANY SMALL REFLECT IDEALS OF AMERICA BUT NOT BRUTE FORCE

Commencement Address Before Naval Academy Sparkles With High Ideals and Flights of Oratory and Offers High Standards for American Citizenship; Navy is Instrument of Righteousness Rather Than Force.

NAVAL ACADEMY, ANNAPOLIS, Md., June 3.—The American navy can only fulfill its highest functions if it acts as an "instrument of righteousness," protecting the proper security of this country while serving no other end, President Coolidge declared today in delivering the commencement address to the graduating class of the naval academy.

"I do not believe the American navy can succeed if it represents naked brute force," said the president, "but to see it represent much more than that. It must make a distinction between right and wrong, and it must be an instrument of righteousness. If we are to promote peace on earth we must have the moral authority of the sword. We must call in action the spiritual and moral force of man."

The president seized the occasion to re-emphasize the universal peacefulness of the American navy. "It is known of all the world that we have never, in our history, harbored any imperialistic designs, nor have we ever sought to attack or be attacked," he said. "So far as we can we are extending the peacefulness of our power and temper of our people, there never was a time when we were less likely than any other nation or combination of nations would or could make any attack on us."

In this connection the president vigorously denounced persons both in and out of the military or naval service who seek to advance away and of preparedness by pronouncing the imminent danger of war or by predicting that the navy has intentions of other aggression.

America Would Not Begin Hostilities, he said. "The suggestion that any other people are harboring a hostile intent toward us is a very serious charge for which we are not prepared to accept responsibility."

HEAT WAVE TAKES FORTY TWO LIVES

Loss of Life and Property Heavy in Midwest Where Heat Wave Continues Unabated; Storms Follow in Wake of Prostrations; Crops Injured.

(United Press.) Forty-two deaths and hundreds of prostrations have occurred during the last 48 hours as a direct or indirect result of the relentless heat which today continued to cause havoc over a large portion of the nation.

Eighteen deaths were reported during the last 24 hours, while 21 occurred in the preceding 24-hour period. Violent electrical storms that brought temporary relief to some sections served only to augment the casualty list in many places.

It is generally reported there is no relief in sight at least for 48 hours. In New York City alone five deaths occurred as a result of heat. Four persons were killed and many hurt in a windstorm that caused \$200,000 damage in Nebraska.

Lightning caused two deaths in Minneapolis and one in St. Paul. Six persons were overcome in Washington where the 24-hour maximum was 106. Atlanta, Ga., reported that unless rain-fall soon severe damage would be done to the cotton crop.

Chicago, June 3.—No relief from the heat wave is in sight for the time being, the weather bureau announced today. Light showers were predicted for portions of the western region and Mississippi valley states but for the most part high temperatures will continue, it was stated.

An additional death brought Chicago's heat toll to seven since the little temperature started. Three persons were overcome. Four persons were killed and many injured in a series of electrical storms that reached cyclonic proportions near Omaha. Property damage in the region was estimated at \$600,000.

NEW YORK, June 3.—Four deaths and many injuries were reported in this city and vicinity during the last 24 hours as a direct or indirect result of the heat wave. A rain of moderate intensity and light showers were predicted for the next 24 hours.

KANSAS CITY, Mo., June 3.—Low clouds and a sultry atmosphere gave promise of more thunder showers in this section today. A rain of moderate intensity swept the city last night. A heavy windstorm near Manhattan wrecked outbuildings but no one was reported injured.

The local authorities finding the "rioters" unmanageable, a riot in which they have not only issued orders to shoot to kill, but have begged foreigners to assist in maintaining order. # LABOR LEIN TO STAND MUST BE LEGALLY FILED

Supreme Court in Case of Nohrberg Against John D. Duke, Who Signs in Hand of Nohrberg Even Though Not Acknowledged Before Notary.

That a chattel mortgage signed by a wife but not acknowledged by her in the presence of a notary is valid against her, and against all save previous creditors, and that labor liens to be valid must be made in compliance with the statute of Idaho, were principal points made by the supreme court in its ruling on the complicated case of Otto Nohrberg against M. H. Boley and others, according to word received by Hottelwell & Chapman, attorneys for Nohrberg today. The first National Bank, represented by Walters & Priddy, was declared in no way liable, and the case is sent back to have Judge Babcock make a specific finding as to whether the evidence submitted by Nohrberg, authorized one of the other defendants, who were represented by Sweeney & Sweeney, to pay money to laborers who claimed to have a labor lien, but who had not been made known to the bank.

The suit grew out of an action by Nohrberg on two notes, for the total sum of \$200,000, made payable to the First National Bank for collection. The first mortgage was placed in record. D. H. Norman held a first mortgage on the crop. After the crop was sold by Nohrberg, the money was placed in the First National Bank, bank claims were made against it, but none placed on record. The bank finally became tired of the litigation as to whether the money should be used for labor claims or not and turned the money over to Day who gave it to Norman. The latter paid the first mortgage, and applied the balance on labor claims. The bank then got concerned and got judgment. The supreme court holds that if Nohrberg authorized the payment of the labor claims, he is bound thereby, but indicates that if he did not, his judgment will stand against all defendants except the First National Bank.

# INSANE PERSON ONLY PAROLED HELD NOT SAFE

Supreme Court Declares That Evidence Regarding Competency of Nohrberg Held by Woman Found to Be of Unsound Mind Finally Adjudged Not Safe.

That a person who has once been judged insane must be so considered until declared sane by either the medical superintendent of the state institution, the resident physician of the institution or by a judicial inquiry for that purpose, and that evidence in regard to the sanity of such insane person cannot be admitted in a suit until discharged as indicated, was ruled this week in the case of W. H. Miller against John Johnson and Henry Johnson carried up from Jerome county by the plaintiff who was represented by Hottelwell & Chapman of this city. Miller bought a farm in Jerome county from Johnson and his wife and paid a substantial sum on it. After he had paid the balance of the purchase price, John Johnson had been paroled, but the deed was not recorded. Miller then placed a lien on the property to have the debt satisfied. During the trial evidence to the effect that Mrs. Johnson at the time she signed was admitted, and Johnson won the case. The supreme court held that since the last time he was paroled, the presumption was that she was still insane, and that the deed was void. It held that Miller was entitled to get back his payment less a reasonable rental to Johnson for two years use of the farm.

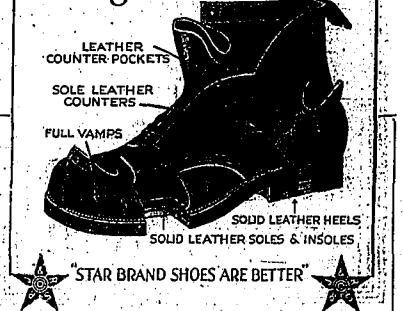
# WOLFE CLAIMS ARE ADJUSTED BY ATTORNEYS
