

Worn out animals, scrub stock, poor in flesh animals Worn out animals, scrub stock, poor in ites animals can find a place but they cannot command a price. One man near Pocatello who uses crobates for his purposes pays two dollars and fifty cents a head for his requirements. The bureau of animal husbandry finds upon a careful investigation, not guess work, that purebred animals show a superiority over grades. Purebreds are not only best for dairy purposes but they are best for meat.

In the experience of stock owners who are in a posi-tion to make comparisons, purebred animals develop more rapidly, are more uniform in quality and appearance, sell better on dull markets, cost no more to raise and bring better prices.

LEAGUE GIVES FULL PROTECTION

Those who argue that the Lengue of Nations is a futile organization will probably gasp when they learn that Congressman Theodore Burton, head of the American delegation declared that the covenant of the league of nations was not a scrap of paper and that it assured the protection of European countries.

It is said that the Lithuanian delegate remarked that he was rejoiced to hear such warm appreciation of the league from the chief of the Americans.

It was proposed to exempt a lot of countries from the disarmament plans because of proximity to Russia, which is not in the league.

It is declared that Mr. Burton explained that the countries it was proposed to except were either or all in part former Russian territory; their exemption seemed reasonable, but if exemptions were extended to adjacent countries they might go on until they reached the Atlantic. He did not believe other countries were in peril. All were league members and he felt certain that the covenant clause concerning aggression was not a scrap of paper.

As a result of assurance of Mr. Burton of his belief in the efficiency of the league as a protection, the report was adopted without the exemptions.

Congressman Burton was formerly United States sen-ator from Ohio, from which he is now a member of the lower house of congress. He was chairman of the nation-al Republican convention of 1924. He is an international authority on finance and his book on panics ranks with the world's best works on the subject.
