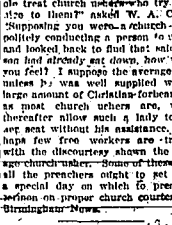

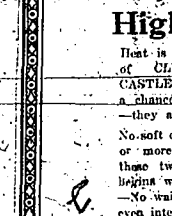

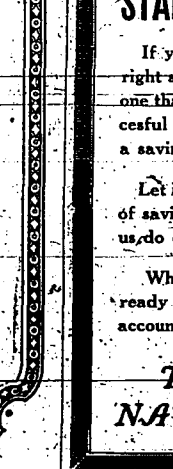

## SHADE WINS BUT WALKER LOSES BOUT

**Fight Fans Turn Over \$500,000 for Admissions to Benefit Bout; Harry Greb Wins Great Fight With Mickey Walker and Again Surprises Fans; Wills Victory Over Weinert Means Nothing; Walker Learns Lesson.**

NEW YORK, July 3.—Mickey Walker's first duty to the world's greatest champion of the sport is to attend to his own business, stay in his own class and fight Dave Shado.

This was the only moral or lesson to be derived from \$25,000 worth of fights for which 40,000 spectators came up close to a half million dollars last night.

Walker, who was set down twice by the New York boxing commission because he would not accept the challenged fight of Shado went off in his class last night and tried to take the middleweight championship from Harry Greb. He got a good purse, and a fine thrashing for his ambition and his stock on the pugilistic market, also suffered a downward movement.

Shado, forced out of his class because no waterweight will fight him proved one of the sensations of the year when he knocked out Jimmy Slattery, a middleweight from Buffalo who had been killed by experts tried all try as they were from Buffalo champion and another sure Corbett.

Shado was one of a few men of his weight who would take a chance with Slattery and there was nothing funny about his victory. He punched Slattery in the forehead three times in the third round and was all set for a final shot when the towel flew from Slattery's corner.

Harry Greb proved himself more of a prizefighter than he ever has been rated and he also has been rated as a prizefighter. He made a complete mess of Walker, whose good show heart saved him in the fourteenth round when Greb had him on the point of a knockout.

Henry Wills, the negro champion for the heavyweight championship ran true to form and knocked out Charley Weinert. The bout proved nothing and it should not have been permitted. If no process of reorganization can be effected by Wills over such a second rate Weinert, he is the outstanding contender in the heavyweight class. Weinert never had a chance. He and started when Wills attacked over a right hand punch in the second round as they were stepping back out of a clinch.

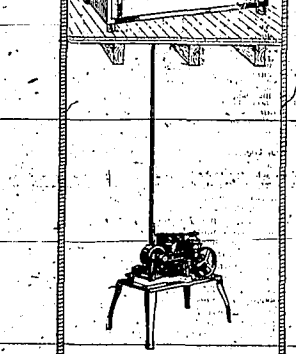
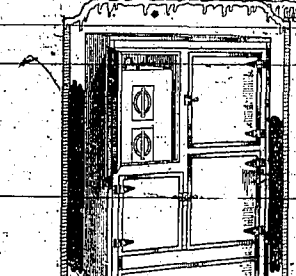

All Twin Falls crops are developing in a splendid manner. The crop this year promises to be a record breaker, and to bring more money into the country than any raised for years.

### Lesson for July 3

#### THE BEGINNING OF FOREIGN MISSIONS

**LESSON TEXT**—Acts 13:1-14.  
**GOLDEN TEXT**—And he said unto them, I have seen all the works and preach the gospel to every creature.—Mark 16:15.  
**PRIMARY TOPIC**—Two Men Become Foreign Missionaries.  
**YOUTH TOPIC**—How Foreign Missions Began.  
**INTERMEDIATE AND SENIOR TOPIC**—The Beginning of Foreign Missions.  
**YOUNG PEOPLE AND ADULT TOPIC**—The Holy Spirit in Foreign Missions.

#### The Gifts of the Church at Antioch, 13

Young as Antioch, the new religious center was, she had prophets and teachers. In Eph. 4:11-12 Paul declares that when Christ ascended He gave gifts to men for the purpose of perfecting the saints unto the work of the ministry. This shows that the church does not exist for itself but for service to others. Christ, the head of the church, came not to be ministered to, but to minister and give His life a ransom for many (Matt. 20:28).

II. Barnabas and Saul Sent Forth (vs. 2, 3).  
 These were the first foreign missionaries sent out. While the five ministers were praying and fasting, the Spirit of God commanded them to send forth Barnabas and Saul. The work of evangelizing the world was laid so heavily upon these men that they refused from fasting in order to seek the will of the Lord in prayer. This is the kind of fasting that meets God's approval. From the fact that they were directed to send forth those whom the Spirit called, we learn that the real call to Christ's service comes from the Spirit of God. The Spirit and the church secured the motion by sending those who were called by Him. The church should be constantly seeking the mind of the Spirit relative to the sending forth of laborers into the vineyard. The Spirit called and the church sent the best men from the church at Antioch. These men seem to have been ready to go forth—day after day—ready to do His will. This about bears attitude toward the Lord's work, holding ourselves in readiness for the immediate execution of His commands. Those who have received the Spirit's call are not taken by surprise when the church sent them forward to their special work.

III. Preaching the Word of God in Cyprus (vs. 4-6).  
 "We are not told as to why they first went to Cyprus, but we are left to infer that it was owing to the fact that it was the home of Barnabas. He was acquainted with the country and possessed property there. It was a responsible hearing among them. He also it is most natural that those who were first sent forth were those who were first to be baptized and tried. Antioch first went to his brother, and the man whom the church sent forth with the greatest pleasure of his request to follow Jesus. Christ commanded him to go home and tell what great things the Lord had done for him (Luke 9:36). As they went forth they carefully carried out that which was commanded of them. The Word of God, not current history, philosophy, ethics, etc. Those who are faithful to God will never preach any thing but His Word. The great news today is Spirit-filled, Spirit-filled the preaching of God's Word. In fact Spirit-filled men will preach nothing else. The opposer of God and Christ can only be successfully met by this Word of God."

IV. Witnessed by Elymas, the Sorcerer (vs. 6-13).  
 Sergius Paulus, the deputy, invited Barnabas and Saul to visit him. He sought to turn his mind from the truth. This is the first obstacle they encountered. The power of the Spirit through the power of the Spirit. This opposer is the same one who came to Adam in the garden of Eden, and who tempted him in the wilderness. He is now sought to bear the gospel as it entered into the hearts of the men and women of the heathen. Paul denounced him in the most scathing terms. He called him the child of the devil, deceived him out of his mind and will, and pronounced him the enemy of all righteousness, accusing him of perverting the truth of God's Word. Surely a man is never more of a villain than when trying to turn a soul from the gospel.

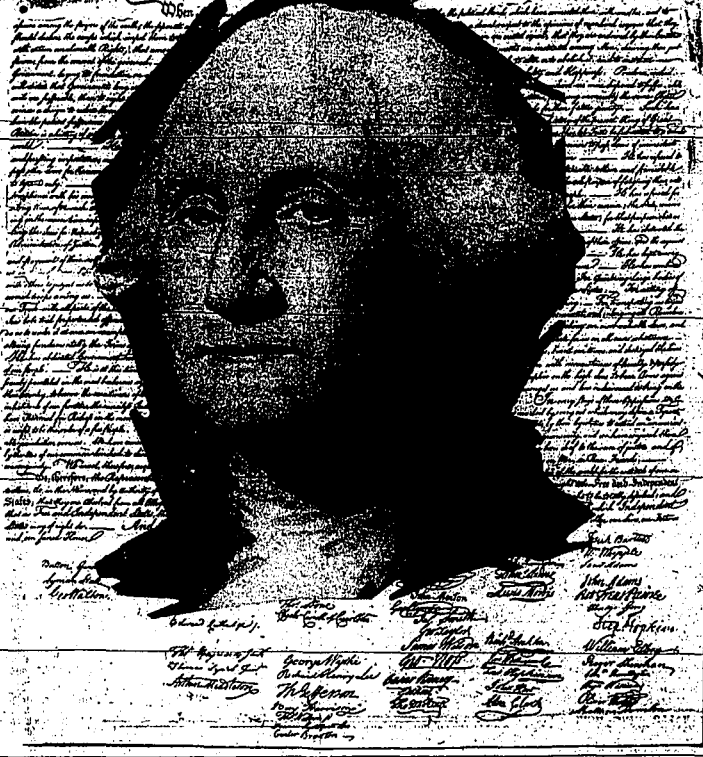
