SCOTT DENIES INSANITY PLEA PREFERS NOOSE

Former Millionaire Gets Second Stay of Sentence Four Hours Before Time to Hang; Prefers to Hang Rather Than Go to Asylum; Says He Is Not Crazy.

CHICAGO, July 23.—"I am not crazy and there will be no attempt to prove that I'm insane," Russell Scott asserted today.

From behind the bars of his prison cell Scott explained how and why his plea that he was sane had been obtained. He said that he had been told that he was sane and he expected to die on the gallows within a few hours.

OPEN DOOR POLICY IS SECOND ONLY TO MONROE DOCTRINE

Hay Open-Door Policy Is Rapidly Outgrowing Second Only to Monroe Doctrine in Pan American States; Speaker for Federal Council of Churches.

CHIATOUVA, N. Y., July 24.—The Hay "open-door" policy in the East is becoming as important to the United States as the Monroe doctrine in the West, declared Dr. Archibald Christison of Glasgow, Scotland, today at the conference on international justice and peace.

A noted authority on international labor conditions and author of "Labor's Magna Charta," he spoke on "International Labor Organizations and World Peace." Most wars, he stated, are due to economic, not political, causes.

League of Nations Is Favored. Addressing the League of Nations he stated that this body represents the Monroe doctrine and by a large majority is in favor of international justice.

More Men Preparing For War Than During 1914 Claim of League

(Copyright 1925 by the United Press.) LONDON, July 24.—Eleven years ago next Wednesday was fired the first shot of the world war, when an elated young Australian officer jerked the lanyard that sent the first shell shrieking into the smoke-filled air.

No little realized that he was initiating the most terrible catastrophe in human history which profoundly modified the map of the world and the lives of all the inhabitants.

Now seven years after the end of the slaughter there are more men preparing and preparing for war than in 1914. Official figures recorded by the United Press from the league of nations in Geneva show there are 6,036,144 men in the standing army of 59 nations.

One of the contributing causes of the great war—the competitive race for supremacy in armaments—is today actively revived. Now it is for the supremacy of the air. Great Britain has prepared an air budget of \$77,565,000 designed to contest France's domination of the air.

Only seven years after the most terrible of wars, nearly every power in Europe and Asia is preparing for the next war. There is a great effort in preparation. Here and there daily airplanes wrought with significance.

Through Europe the United Press has collected at random a few notes of these portents—stirring warnings which way the wind is blowing. Sir Laming Worthington-Evans, British secretary of state for war, replying to a parliamentary question, said British scientists have killed 1,000 animals during the past year in research for poison gases.

Massault, speaking to the Italian chamber, said "the year that the next war was the last war it is not the last war. And we must not forget that the next war will be fought in the air."

The Japanese navy department announced the construction of 22 warships with a total tonnage of 121,096 tons decided to send seven exports to France, five to the United States, three each to England and Germany to investigate new weapons.

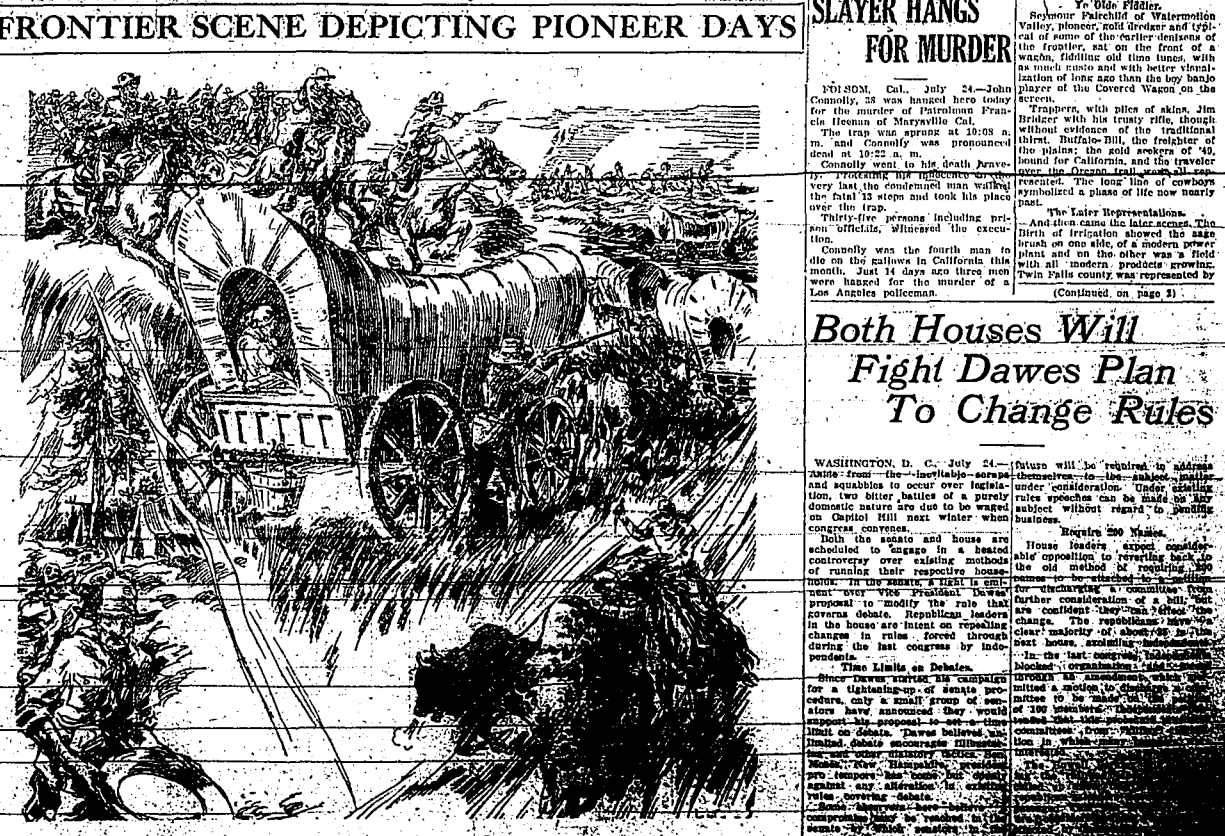

THE FARM AS A CORPORATION

Won't it be fun when the farmer gets organized and lets the government fix it so there will be no competition. All this will have to do there is to take his books and figure up his expenses and then charge enough for wheat, corn, livestock and his various products to make a profit on his investment.

Placing the same value on his land that the railroads place on their holdings his farm will be put in at about \$100 an acre. Then "pa," he being the owner must have a salary as president, say about \$6000 a year. "Ma," of course, being a prominent member of the corporation and doing much of the heavy work is entitled to an office and a salary, she ought to be vice president and she is worth every dollar of a \$4000 a year salary.

Tommy, an agricultural expert, should be paid \$3000 and of course Sister Kate should be on the salary list at a salary of at least \$2500. Then, of course, the depreciation must be charged off, taxes must be arranged for and operating expenses other than the salaries of the officials must be taken care of. Now everything is nicely arranged for figuring what the products of the farm should bring. Just let the government guarantee, say 5 per cent on the investment and everything is lovely.

The above is rather ridiculous reading but if one will search long enough in this old United States he might be able to find many businesses that are paying a handsome profit on just about such a comparative condition.—Deming Bulletin.
