

There has been a large increase this year for every month over a corresponding month of last year, the average running about half a million dollars. Still greater improvement is expected when the crops are sold.

It should not be necessary to raise a protest against the destruction of wild showers. The beauty of the flowers in their natural setting ought to soften the hearts of the vandals. Following is some heartening information: By using pure bred bulls daughters produced 35 more cans of milk and 127 more pounds of butter; granddaughters produced 78 more cans of milk and 280 more pounds of butter. In fifteen years the production was 180 per cent more milk than the original scrub group. Then follows this remarkable statement which ought to be burned into the brain of every Idaho farmer. One of the most amusing examples of this sort of patronizing comment is that of the American Economist, the ablest of trust organs. Its comments are

It says that Bryan was superficial, and at the same time admits that many of the things he advocated have been adopted. At least one great thing he advocated was carried out by him as secretary of state. The 30 cooling-off treaties were his own. Senator Kellogg, now secretary of state, said in the senate that had 30 nations signed these all around instead of 30 signing with the United States, the world war would not have taken place. The Economist charges Bryan with lack of tenacity yet concedes that he stuck to his views on the tariff to the end. It calls him a fire brand. Years ago, when Finley Peter Dunne was at his best and when a London paper said he was the wisest man writing, that brilliant essayist said "Bryan is as conservative as Taft." What Dunne meant was that so far as the fundamentals of our country are concerned, Bryan, would no more disturb them than Taft would. He was not an advocate of absolute free trade, but as he opposed protection, he is so classed by the Economist.
