U. S. FAILS TO ENFORCE DRY LAW. The enforcement of prohibition became such a farce that the liquor interests were emboldened to believe the end was at hand. An intensive campaign was launched and was formidable. But the people began demanding counter activity with the result that the law is to be enforced practically for the first time.

Laws are made to be enforced. They do not enforce themselves automatically. This particular law was bandied about from pillar to post and enforced half heartedly in most instances. It was enacted to be enforced, not to satisfy an element. It represents the judgment of the people on that issue. No law has ever been enacted which has been so systematically disregarded.

The years since the thirty-sixth state ratified and the president proclaimed the eighteenth amendment, have been unsatisfactory ones in law enforcement. All laws have been flagrantly disregarded and this one was given as the chief cause. That time is to end. All laws will be more rigidly enforced. The people are tired of trifling, tired of letting the big fellows slip out and the little fellows being punished. The law was made for all and its enforcement should be as impartial as justice.—Idaho State Journal.

GOODING'S TAXATION IDEAS. Senator Gooding has begun his campaign for re-election and re-election next year. In fact it has been under way for some time, but there is evidence that the fighting senator is getting in real honest-to-goodness earnest as time advances.

The senator's latest bid for popular favor was his appearance before the state board of equalization last week with a passionate appeal for a lower valuation on farm lands for taxation purposes. Just how or when or why the junior senator was selected as special advocate for the owners of farm property, or by what authority he happened to represent them has not been disclosed, but just the same he was Johnny-on-the-Spot with a plea for justice, according to his process of reasoning.

His startling proposition, as reported in the Statesman, is that the way to reduce taxes is to reduce assessments. Therefore, the taxes on farm property will be less when assessments on farm property are less.

It would seem too plain to permit of argument to assume that a reduction of assessed valuation could only result in an increase of the levy—UNLESS EXPENDITURES WERE REDUCED. Possibly Senator Gooding has some ideas as to the reduction of expenses; but if so they were not given in the report of his address.

He knows, as the entire state knows, that Idaho has a ridiculously top-heavy state government, with a cabinet suited to a state several times as populous and wealthy as this. He knows that in order to cure for this incubus, bonds were wickedly and unnecessarily saddled onto the state university in the last session of the legislature on the plea that the additional money was needed for necessary improvements. He knows that a cut in state expenses sufficient to have met those improvements could have been made if it had not been for the necessity for maintaining the cabinet form of government. And he knows that the necessity for maintaining this heavy load is to continue the further grip that the political machine has on Idaho. The people and taxpayers don't need it but the politicians do, so it is kept hanging like a millstone around the neck of the farmers of Idaho for whose welfare Senator Gooding is so suddenly solicitous.

Note this. The political fortunes of Senator Gooding are inextricably bound with the Idaho machine. He could not, if he would, make a move to weaken its power in the state. Therefore he is most absolutely mum when it comes to cutting off any portion of the state house expense. And speaking of a readjustment of taxation which would benefit the farmer and make for real equity, why does not Senator Gooding advocate a tax on mining property which would be commensurate with present taxes on farm property?

But, while ostensibly pleading for the interests of the farmer, the senator is strangely silent, both on the matter of decreasing expenditures and increasing the amount of taxes which could and should be derived from mining property. To do the first, would sever his relations with the Idaho machine. To do the second, would antagonize from his support the powerful mine owners' association. Either would be fatal to his chances for returning to the senate. So, he must perforce attempt to gain friends among the farmers by a proposal that would be execrably funny if it were not ridiculous.—Fairfield Courier.

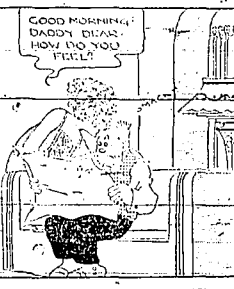

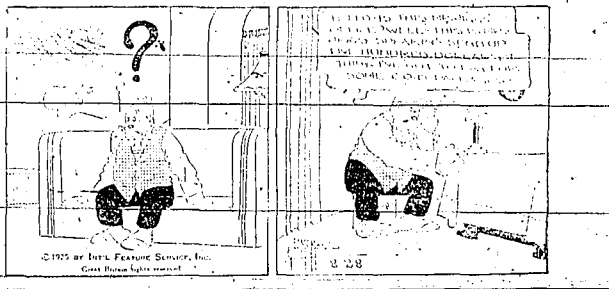
