"MOUNTAIN MAN!"

Pennsylvania State Police Take Dying Words of Gallant Trooper as Epitome of Their Indomitable Purpose.



It should get that man!
Two weeks ago in the north of the Pennsylvania State Police trooper, surrounded by the Lincoln Highway. Then, he collapsed. His dark-red body was found in the brush. When they reached him he was dead—a bullet through his head.

Thus, on the Pennsylvania stretch of the great artery of national automobile traffic at the point where Adams and Franklin Counties meet, died Trooper Francis Haley, his lips framing that ringing appeal which, disdaining mortal wounds, placed duty first.

Get that man!
The five troopers of the Pennsylvania State Police have taken Haley's death as an heroic tradition, his dying words as the epitome of their purpose.

That tragic scene in the Blue Ridge Mountains of the Keystone Commonwealth is described to recruit troopers as the supreme height of duty and the greatest instance of the highest deeds of the State Police.

How Haley Died
Haley died in the performance of his duty. He had assigned to stop a motorist suspected of the robbery of the Abbotstown, Adams County, bank. The motorist was the formidable summer resort at Greenbrier. Haley, seen the State trooper in swift pursuit of the lone motorist, who drove directly in front of the trooper. Haley threw up his hand in signal to stop. They saw the car was a 1929 model and he was operating a truckload of liquor. If his driver is not a hoodlum, he is a bootlegger.

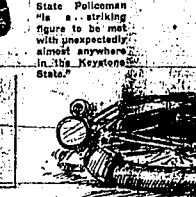
