

The debate over states' rights is livelier than ever. The dreat of centralized power stalks abroad. One group cries out that we are suffering from "government by the courts." Another replies that the courts are our only bulwards of Americanism.

There should be no rush and sudden changes in our system, but we know that changes must and will be made.


