CAPITALISM IS FOUGHT BY DEFOUND

Fund Amounting to \$800,000 Has Grown to Over 20 Million and Was Set Aside to Fight Capitalism, Broadcasting Station Will Send Out Radical Dope.

NEW YORK, Sept. 25.—A fund set aside to fight capitalism has mounted an elaborate campaign and George F. Baker, one of the city's wealthiest and most conservative bankers, has been named as the man making money for the fund. This ironic act came to light when it was learned that the fund had made more than \$1,000,000.

Although \$500,000 had been given away to various relief groups, the fund is still valued at more than \$1,300,000 and according to Charles E. Loring, editor for the foundation, it is sought for the ever increasing output.

Mr. Loring's report carried by the United Press yesterday that a broadcast station was to be secured to disseminate advanced ideas "denied the foundation in the newspapers."

Most of the money thus far donated has been given to relief newspapers in New York, Seattle, Oklahoma City, Minneapolis and Chicago.

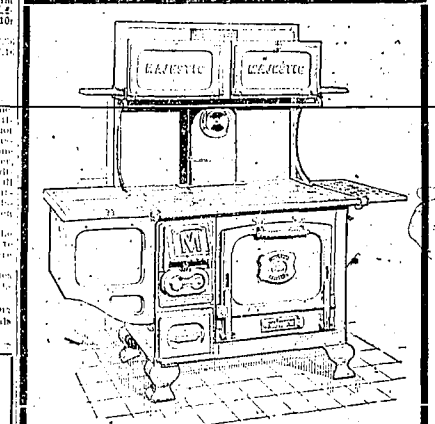

Legal provision for the establishment of kindergartens has been made by all but four of the States. Although the laws vary materially, they include in 31 States definite standards for kindergarten teachers.

Schools in the United States reporting school savings systems increased from 6,868 to 9,080 during the year closing June 30, 1924, according to figures recently compiled by the American Bankers' Association.

White illiteracy in Alabama has been reduced by 66.6 per cent in 36 years, and negro illiteracy by 55.7 per cent. Educational leaders have launched a campaign for equalization of taxes, better roads, more and better school equipment, free textbooks, longer school terms, physical and health education, vocational training, and equal educational opportunity for all the youth of the State.

THE GOODING RAILROAD BILL

The application on the part of the western railroads for a five per cent increase in freight rates will make more pertinent in the next session of congress the matter of the merger of the railroads of the country and a complete readjustment of freight rates to the point with the present discrimination complained of will be done away with.

The eastern railroads with their short haul, in and through a country of dense population and which railroads on account of that fact make big returns on their investments, will be obliged to enter into a common pot or pool with the western or long haul railroads which operate through a country of sparse population and where the rates must be high in order to cover operating expenses.

The Spokesman review in an editorial article on the question of the Gooding 'Long and Short Haul' bill says: 'A statement from the capital, obviously made with Mr. Coolidge's approval, after a conference with Senator Watson, chairman of the interstate commerce committee, announces that railroad legislation has been placed on the administration calendar for the next session of congress.

That takes up the lid that was clamped down in the house at the last session and behind the Gooding bill in house committee after it had passed the senate, 54 to 23.

The administration's program comprises three objects:

'Consolidation of railroads along sound economic lines, as invited by the law of 1920 but not accepted or worked out by the roads. It is now proposed to amend the Esch-Cummings law so as to make consolidation compulsory after six or seven years.

'Readjustment of the railroad labor board.

'And a tackling of the pending dispute on long and short haul rates.

'That is glad news for the interior and the supporters of the Gooding bill. They will rejoice at this opportunity to put their cause squarely before the house, as they had already succeeded in putting it before the senate.

'They tried to get their cause before the house at the last session, but were choked off in the committee on interstate and foreign commerce, under the chairmanship of Representative Samuel E. Winslow of Massachusetts.

'By a narrow majority the committee pigeonholed the bill and refused to report it out for discussion by the general house membership.

'Mr. Winslow was not a candidate for reelection.

'Only by passage of the Gooding bill, or a substitute measure, can the long-standing issue over long and short haul rates be settled. In substance it forbids the railroads, under the plea of meeting water competition, to charge higher rates for the shorter haul and lesser service than they charge for the longer haul and the greater service.

'Only by the passage of the Gooding bill can congress give the breath of life to its declared policy, expressed in the transportation act of 1920, "to foster and preserve in full vigor both rail and water transportation."
