This has been called the greatest gathering of the joint organizations and it is keeping up to that standard.

### -FARMERS GO 47,000,000 MILES TO MARKET

If the farmers of the United States made only one trip to market every year, they would travel over 47,000,000 miles. Applied to the wheat crop alone, at an average cost of 30 cents per ton per mile haul, they yearly spend more than \$44,000,000 to move the nation's bread crop from the farm granary to the local elevator.

These figures are disclosed in-the-September Index of farm conditions issued by the Agricultural Foundation, niade public today. According to estimates made by over \$500 field observers, the average farmer has to haul his produce 7.39 miles to a shipping point. This varies from 3.22 miles in the northeast dairy belt, to 15.23 miles in the range states.

"It is readily apparent from these figures," says Samuel R. Guard, director of the Foundation, "that hauling costs are a very important factor in the marketing of American farm produce. One may also gather some impression from this staggering item, what good roads mean to the producer. For as roads are improved, lauling costs are reduced. There is a hig saving in time, as well as in actual money and labor. On general farm overhead, such reductions are bound to be felt. Hard surfaced roads are doing much to relieve this pressing though necessary burden."

The Index also shows that while farmers triad hard.

The Index also shows that while farmers tried hard-in-1925, the physical volume of agricultural output as expressed in bushels, tons, barrels and bales, will be smaller than in 1924, and below the average of the last five years. There was a 2 per cent increase in acreage, but more than half of that was in cotton. The acreage of seven of the crops in the last were smaller than last year.

Fortunately, the corn crop is a large one, and the first in so great that it will largely overbalance the decreases in the less important crops, on a tonnage basis. The Foundation reiterates its August estimate of three billion bushel corn crop, and states that the influences of the drought were counteracted by the late arrival of frosts. The average yield is estimated at 30 bushels per acre, as against 23.2 bushels per acre last year. According to government estimates, the total corn acreage is approximately 100,000,000.

Another feature of the Index is the comment on the 1926 winter wheat acreage. A recent official estimate of the intended sowing of winter wheat stated there probably would be an increase of about 10 per cent over last year. The average given by the Foundation's observers showed an increase of .4 per cent, which is practically nil. Declining wheat prices and drought have been largely responsible for these actual sowings as compared to intended sowings as of August, says the report.

Attention also is drawn to the improvement in beer eattle markets. Average prices for steers at Chicago are given as \$2 higher than a year ago and the highest since 1920. Choice and prime grades are selling at \$4 higher than a year ago and are unusually scarce as a result of a short corn crop in 1924. The strength is not due to light receipts, however, but rather to a broadening of demand for beef because of higher pork prices. There was an increase of 7 per cent in the number of cattle slaughtered and calves and sheep show increases of 12 and 3 per cent. The 1925 wool clip is rated at 4 per cent above that of last year.

The general improvement in the price situation, and the better-than-expected corn crop out turns in the droughfusticken areas have combined to give an index number of \$4.7 as compared with \$3.2 a month ago. This is the percentage of normal conditions as expressed by 100 per cent. Much of this gain has occurred in the central cotton belt and in regions farther north, where tardy frosts have permitted the riponing of late crops.
