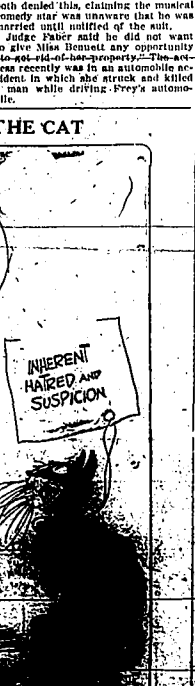

## ROAD BUILDING

ROAD CONSTRUCTION IN UNITED STATES

The chief of the United States bureau of public roads, Thomas H. Macdonald, said today that the road-building program of the state and is ever watchful for the interests of the federal appropriation...

"If the estimate of \$4,000,000 to be under construction for 1927 is not reached, it will be met by \$5,000,000 or even \$10,000,000, the balance available for new construction would not be sufficient to carry any reasonable program for 1928 and 1929...

"One of the fundamental principles of the federal budget plan is elimination of waste and inefficiency in the expenditure of public funds.

The Federal Aid Highways Bill, introduced by Representative Frank B. Rowland of Tennessee, is the latest effort which the bill has in their hands to be checked up for the past two weeks.

"Up to March 1 of this year the federal aid highways which have been completed since 1916 totaled \$3,986 million, and \$2,500 million were under construction and reported as 30 per cent complete.

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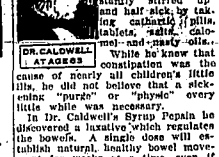

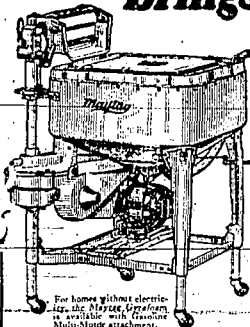
