

JEROME NEWS AGAINST ONIONS AND BRIDGES

Apparently determined to decry everything in Twin Falls because of its opposition to the rim to rim bridge, the Jerome News devotes a long article in its present is sue to casting doubt on the correctness of the story published in the Times of Thursday of last week regarding the onion crop raised by Elmer H. Snyder of Filer. The Times story, according to accurate measurement, was a little too conservative. It was received from Director N. V. Sharp, member of the canal board. A week later, the Filer Record published the exact measurement of the land showing that instead of 1000 sacks, as stated in the Times, the total was 1047 sacks per acre. Why should the Northside News take pleasure in reflecting on the fertility and productivity of Twin Falls southside lands? The land on both sides of the river is approximately alike. If the Northside News will devote a little of the time it spends trying to conjure up reasons for opposing the bridge to getting accurate data about production on its own side of the river, it will not have to worry about the directul effects of the construction of the rim to rim bridge.

The News admits that it is overly conservative in jublishing information regarding northside crops, since it confesses that its estimate of July 16, was only from one-third to one-half actual production. onion crop raised by Elmer H. Snyder of Filer. The Times

In reply to a communication on the bridge from Paul M. Maxwell, the News argues that "the Chinese wall was necessary as a means of self-preservation" because it asserts, "without it China would have been overrun by war-like mercenary hordes." The implication seems to be that it fears that a host of Twin Falls folk absorbing strength from Filer onions, and thirsting for the blood of innocent Jeromites would devastate the land of Jerome. Brother Nims, like Horatius of old, will stand at the end of the structure to repel the invading plunders while the trusty few over there who oppose the bridge will send the nefarious improvement into the swirling snake. Verily the "brave days of old" are still in our midst.
