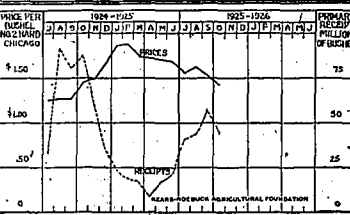

35 To 50 Million Bushels More Wheat Than Expected



Wheat market prospects from the more than last year. Argentina and Canada, as well as the world wheat crop, are not as strong as they appeared in mid-summer, but the United States will produce 35 to 50 million bushels more than expected at this time. Canada has come through with a big crop, the North American yield will be only about 45 million bushels under 1924, according to a survey of the wheat situation just completed by the observers of the Sears-Roebuck Agricultural Foundation.

"Europe, exclusive of Russia, has about 270 million bushels more wheat than last year. 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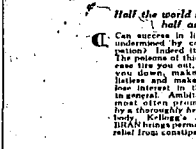
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PASTOR OF CHRISTIAN CHURCH HERE PLURIBUS IN THIS CITY
