

FARMERS AND THE TARIFF

President Coolidge made a fine impression in Chicago. He spoke deliberately and candidly. He was frequently applauded. However the dispatches say that when he spoke of the tariff and the farmer his remarks were received in silence. There were practical farmers present from forty states. This is significant. For threquarters of a century the farmers have been the background for tariff legislation. They have always been protectionists. Lately they have shown signs of unrest.

Whether it is dissatisfaction with the tariff or indicates a spirit of rebellion against what they conceive to be an unfair advantage cannot be told. But certain it is there is a significance to it that must have attention. When farmers listen in stoic silence to the utterances of the president of the United States on the tariff it has a meaning that cannot be brushed aside.—Idaho State Journal (Rep.). The Journal then proceeds to argue that the farmers er in not applauding the tariff. However, the meaning of the failure of the farmers to applaud is not far to seek. The most conservative of their organizations have figured that the tillers of the soil lose at least \$300,000,000 a year more than they gain under the most favorable conditions from the present tariff law.

There are two lines of thought among farm opponents of the law. One element declares that in order to get back what they pay out extra, a law along the line of the law McNary-Haugen bill should be enacted. Another element believes that the administration is right in declaring such law impractical; and urges that since there is no way of balancing up the extra tariff burden on the farmer, the tariff ought to be revised downward on manufacturered products. A strong movement has started among manufacturing trusts to have the anti-trust law repealed without cutting down the tariff, and this has not tended to rekindle the fires of rural enthusiasm for a high tariff, which favors the manufacturers at their expense.


