THREE DIE WATCHING FESTIVAL

Grandstand at Pasadena Collapses With Big Fall

MANY INJURED

Hospital Report That More of Victims of Crash May Succumb.

PASADENA, Calif., Jan. 2.—Tragedy struck a crowded competitor of the Rose Tournament of Roses for the first time when the funeral parlor was crowded, trapping 37 persons inside. One man died and 36 were injured, along the line of march, exceeding a total of several dead and many injured. A check of the injured today showed 118 persons in local hospitals suffering from the effects of the accident.

The death toll was high and it was feared the total would mount higher, as several of those in hospitals were in a critical condition.

Two persons died after injuries received in the accident. Alabamians, numbering more than 500 persons in a mass of broken timbers and splinters, "Mrs. Jessie Hartes," 41, just recovered shortly after the accident, suffered a fatal heart attack.

An unnamed woman was killed from shock incurred while witnessing the terrible tragedy. Mrs. C. W. Hunt, 51, stunned by the crash, swooned and fell from the roof of a building.

Mrs. Hartes, from the street, died from heart attack.

Both Los Angeles and Pasadena authorities investigated the accident to determine if it was the result of criminal negligence.

As Mayor, district attorney and city council issued a formal statement declaring that it was found that the persons who created the accident had been negligent.

It was announced that no prosecution would follow. The Los Angeles county grand jury also pledged "absolute justice."

NEW PLAN IN COAL STRIKE NEGOTIATIONS

Anthracite Operators Acting as Individuals and Not as a Body May Open Mines to Workers Who Would Return.

NEW YORK, Jan. 2.—A plan whereby operators acting as individuals and not as a body would throw open their mines to permit all miners discharged after most of them returned to work will be discussed at a meeting of spelling negotiators of the wage scale committee in conference here.

"No action in this direction will be taken, however, until the operators, who are members of the anthracite miners' union, are scheduled to resume negotiations at the Union League club, it was learned.

Union leaders are confident that the majority of the miners is strong enough to carry through their plan to the operators to break the backbone of the anthracite cleanup which has brought suffering and privation to the miners and their families.

Countess Brings Suit

"You are here," was White's reply, as the other prisoners held in connection with the affair told their stories.

White pleaded that he was the victim of a frame-up by Goff and Strimberg.

CUSTOM TOLLS
REACH BILLION

Collections for Past Year Amount to Nearly \$500,000,000 More Than Those of Year Previous, Treasury Reports.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan. 2.—Collection of custom duties this year will amount to more than one billion dollars, an increase of nearly half billion dollars over last year, treasury department officials predicted today.

Cooperation between provincial border patrols and custom officials will result in the best revenue collection, it was said.

At some points along the Mexican and Canadian boundaries, receipts have increased as much as 400 per cent in a single month, since the patrols began functioning in September.

EASING BURDEN OF STATE TAX

Banker of Nats Points Out Benefits of "Community Property" System in Effect in Some States.

Favorable aspects of tax systems are now among the most highly prized assets of our states, it is pointed out in the American Bankers Association Journal in connection with an article on how California's tax, which never had a state income tax, cuts state and federal taxes nearly in half by the "community property" system.

In R. Rosenberg, Vice President of the Los Angeles Bank, Los Angeles, author of the article, says that a recent amendment in the tax law enables future residents of the state to take advantage of it. Reference is made to a former article by Mr. Rosenberg in this paper, in which he discusses the California tax reform and citing a hypothetical case involving California inheritance taxes which might have been levied in 1926, had the new law not been passed, Mr. Rosenberg declares, so that the figures then given do not correctly represent the present situation. *It says:*

"Under the old administration California has had the 'community property' system. Most other states have a similar system. Community property is property accumulated by married persons during their marriage, except that which is acquired by gift, bequest or inheritance. Approximately 55 per cent of all property in the state is 'community property.'

"Such a system is the most favorable position in regard to death taxes, both state and Federal, of any state in the Union, (excepting possibly the eight other states that have a similar system), including New Mexico, Wyoming, Montana, Idaho, Nevada, Washington, Texas, whatever. The California 'community property' system is recognized for the purpose of levying Federal estate taxes, while Florida's estate tax is based, while in Florida the whole estate, or a decedent is subject to the Federal tax.

How the Law Works

"California's law expressly provides that upon the death of either spouse or of both spouses, all of their net 'community property' shall be subject to inheritance taxes."

"As the result of an amendment made to the California inheritance tax law by the 1925 Legislature, this amount is freed from the inheritance tax. Thus, there extends to 'community property' of nonresident married persons, who hereafter take up their legal residence in the state, the full exemption from the Federal estate tax, provided, however, that the death tax exists in any other state in the Union, with the possible exception of the other community property states, which would add 15 per cent to property in the state coming under this definition, which means approximately 30 per cent of all property probably payable in Federal estate tax."

"To illustrate, the following example of a man survived by a wife and two minor children is computed, the estate consisting of \$10,000 cash, \$10,000 in real property, \$10,000 in personal property, \$10,000 in debts, \$10,000 in Federal estate tax."

"As a subject of comparison, take a state which has no inheritance tax, such as New Mexico, which has a tax of 10 per cent on the estates which impose inheritance taxes, but do not have the 'community property' system, the advantage of which California would be more than \$10,000."




