

PRICE FIXING IS IMPOSED ON FARM CROPS

Governor Lowden's Price Fixing Plan Meets—Bitter Opposition; Illinois Plan Would Stabilize Prices and Encourage Export of Farm Products.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 15.—Members of the house agriculture committee today clashed with witnesses at a hearing on farm relief measures over the price fixing plan of former Governor Lowden of Illinois.

Chairman Hansen asked John P. Wallace, Iowa farmer, publisher, "If the failure of the government at its only venture of the kind was not sufficient, the question followed—would you support a report that Lowden had the great majority of co-operators here as a price fixing plan?"

"That report is false," Wallace said. He said Lowden had come to New York to get an engagement. Representative Wallace asked of the Illinois legislature explained to the committee a plan of export bounties on wheat, corn, hogs and cattle to add just price on farm products to an excise tax and a tariff provision.

Adcock said this plan, which was adopted as a resolution of the Illinois legislature, would stabilize domestic prices and encourage export of surplus farm products.

IDAHO FARM SURVEY MADE BY U.S. CENSUS

Agricultural Census Shows That Nearly Two Tuos- sand Farms Operated in Idaho in 1925 Than in 1920; Canyon Leads the Counties in Number of Farms.

Farm operators in Idaho in 1925 numbered 1,922, compared with 1,202 in 1920, and 1,397 in 1910, according to preliminary figures of the United States census of agriculture.

Canyon county has the largest number of farms, 314, and Shoshone the fewest, 11.

In the United States farms numbered 6,372,423 in 1925, compared with 4,292,000 in 1920, and 3,261,022 in 1910. Texas has more farms than any other state, 466,236, followed by North Carolina, 345,422. Idaho ranks thirty-sixth among the states. Fewer farms are in Nevada, 292, and Rhode Island, 391.

Old Closure Rule May Be Restored to Check Debate on World Court and Force an Early Vote; Opponents Plan Long Fillibuster on Court Vote.

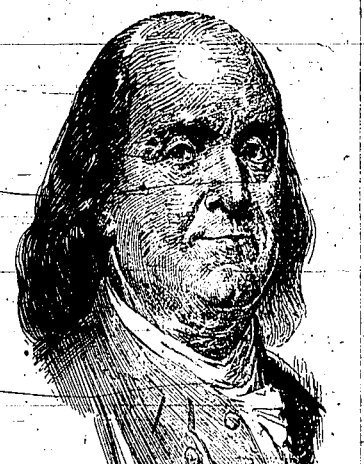
WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan. 16.—An old closure rule is to be restored by world court adherents in the senate to force an early vote on the proposed international tribunal.

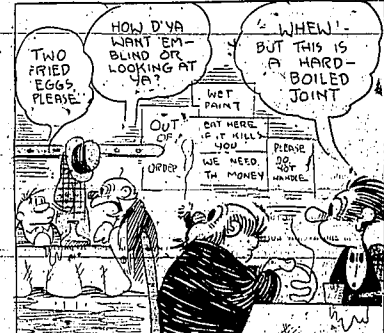
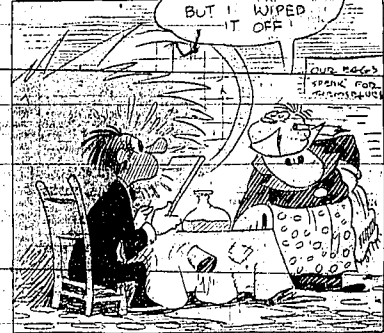
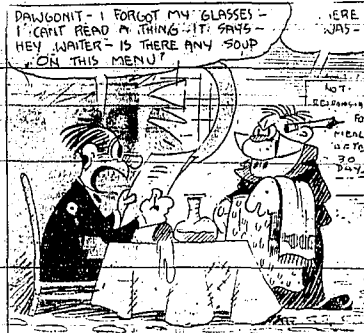
DIVINE POWER

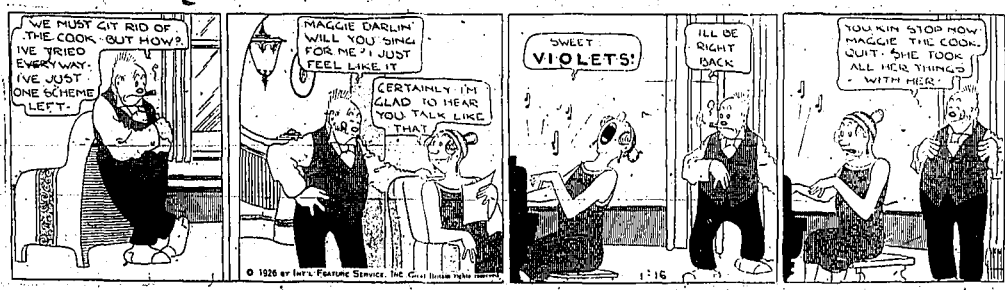
