

TRIBUNAL HAS LESS SUPPORT

Senator Pine of Oklahoma Joins Court Plan Opposition.

CONTINUE TALK

Vote on Proposition Is Rejected in Favor of Discussion.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 22.—Under the "vote or talk" ultimatum of administration leaders, Senate freemen today chose to talk and entered the seventh day of their filibuster against the world court today, with Chairman Borah of the foreign relations committee holding the floor.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 22.—The freemen rallied their first convert to the vicious battle they are waging against the world court when an administration senator, W. B. Pine, Oklahoma, republican today entered their camp.

"My party is for the world court, but my state is against it and I will vote for my state," Pine said in announcing his position. Previously he had been considered for the majority.

With this chance, a complete poll of the senate was made, showing the following lineup at this point in the battle: Reps., 11; democrats, 36; total 72. Against the court, republicans, 15; democrats, 3; farmer labor, 1; total, 19.

This gives the court 13 more votes than the necessary two-thirds majority for its adoption. The conversion of Pine gave the filibusters new life as the administration leaders pressed harder upon them for a vote. "Borahs were made that day after adjournment, if present facilities are exhausted," Pine said. He is presented by 16 administration senators asking limitation of the debate. Chairman Borah of the finance committee, has today agreed to withhold the tax bill until some solution of the present difficulties is found and he may not bring it up Monday as expected.

MANY CITIES SUFFER COLD WAVE TODAY

FASCIST GETS FIRST CHAPTER FOR AMERICANS

Secret Order Is Established in Ohio, and Is Composed of Highest Type of Italians, Report.

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 22.—Announcement of the first American chapter of the Italian Fascist movement here today.

The order, known as the League of the Fascist, has 50 charter members, drawn from Italian workers in the Philadelphia area.

The organization is secret, according to its president, Enrico Perrelli. It was formed here but its formation was through sympathy for the Fascist movement in Italy. The membership is said to be composed of the highest type of Italian. Members found violating any law of the United States whether they are citizens or not, will be expelled. American citizens of Italian blood who are not members are urged to join.

MAY RE-OPEN PARLEYS TO END STRIKE

Mine Workers Chief Agrees to Resume Negotiations for Anthracite Settlement After Meeting Editor.

SCRANTON, Pa., Jan. 22.—President John L. Lewis of the United Mine Workers today agreed to request reopening of the negotiations with the mine owners to settle the anthracite strike.

Later it was announced that Lewis had accepted the Lyneet plan as a basis for negotiations and possible settlement.

Lewis told Lyneet that the United Mine Workers stand willing to enter again into joint negotiations with the coal operators.

The operators are said virtually to have accepted the plan advanced by Lyneet and predictions were made here that within 24 hours the anthracite strike would join in a request to Chairman John Markle of the joint conference to call another meeting to attempt negotiations of a settlement.

An Idahoan, recently returned from southern California, is indignant over the quality of potatoes put on the market in California in "branded bags," the contents of which are placed on the market as the best of that famous Idaho product, and the product is so poor that it makes the well informed potato grower both ashamed and indignant.

The branded bag may have been a protection in the first instance and it is hoped at least that a superior quality was shipped, but an empty bag is no guarantee and anyone securing possession of it can refill it with any sort of commodity and palm it off as the genuine article to the detriment of the original producer.

The Idaho potato grower and the dealer, and all who have any part in the handling of the product, owe it to themselves and the state to protect the interest of the famous Idaho product and seek some method whereby the grade may be protected.

The returned Idaho potato dealer that he visited place after place asking for Idaho potatoes and in no one instance was he able to get anything that even resembled an Idaho potato, but he was offered any amount of inferior product from bags bearing the Idaho brand.

Either the brand will have to be copyrighted or the select product placed in sealed containers so that the purchaser may be sure of getting what he pays for.

That the small packager pays is testified to by the fact that at least one institution has made a fortune by that method and others are taking it up.

Idaho potato producers have an association. Idaho potato dealers have an organization. Why cannot the two cooperate in the matter of devising some method that will protect the product and them, and incidentally make a greater profit from their product and business?—Exchange.
