# Wells Excursion Was Huge Success

### MAILS GREAT BOOST TO IDAHOANS

Inauguration of Elko-Boise-Pasco Route Marks New Step in Progress of State and Cuts Time.

Walter Varney Will Commence Flying on Long Stretch April 6 With Daily Service.

BOISE, Feb. 16.—Inauguration of the Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Utah and Nevada mail service will start operations April 6, marking another step in the tremendous program of the great northwest, speed in commerce to the keynote to success in America today and the northwest is quick to realize the importance of fast mail transportation.

Walter C. Varney, contractor, announced that the Washington, Oregon, Idaho mail service will launch its first trip on the morning of April 6, from Elko, Nevada, to Pasco, Washington, and will also daily mail service thereafter. The equipment of the new air mail service consists of six planes, a crew of four pilots, and three mechanics. The line connects directly with the transcontinental route at Elko, and brings every city and town in the northwest within a four or five day's ride of the coast. The close contact between industry and banking houses of the northwest, the flow of the mail, the gathering of the natural resources of the country with the eastern markets, effected by fast mail transportation, is invaluable.

For years the transcontinental air mail service has been in operation, having approximately daily service. An average of 290 pounds of mail a day is carried over the transcontinental air mail between San Francisco and New York. More than 6,000,000 pounds of mail have been transported over 10,000,000 miles since the beginning of the service.

Ten cents an ounce is the postage required to send an air mail letter to New York, Los Angeles, San Francisco, Chicago, and 25 cents to the New York zone. The postage department has been instructed to mail intended to be carried by airplane be plainly marked in the upper left-hand corner with the stamp and above the address, "via air mail."

### ARMY FUNDS BILL PASSES INTO SENATE

Measures Approved by House Today, Provides for 113,700 Enlisted Men, 12,000 Officers and Supplies.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 16.—The annual war department appropriation bill carrying \$2,395,000,224, an increase of \$1,025,283 over the previous year, was passed today by the house. The measure provides for an uncommitted personnel of 113,700 men and an office personnel of 12,000.

Funds in the bill for military activities totals \$26,091,169 while non-military activities receive \$18,000,000. Appropriations for non-military work was increased \$2,713,740, more than five-tenths of the total increase.

The bill carries an appropriation of \$1,615,000,000 and a contract authorization of \$3,000,000 for the air service. These funds will provide for the purchase of 30 new bombers.

The Ordnance department receives \$2,545,871, an increase of \$2,000,000 for replacing ammunition stores.

### White House Roof in Grave Danger

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 16.—Warned by constant deterioration of supports, the White House roof is in danger of crashing down upon the occupants of the executive mansion, Major F. R. Grant, public building director, told the house appropriations committee today during consideration of the independent offices supply bill.

Grant described the mansion roof as being in "a very dangerous condition," and warned that it may collapse in the event of a heavy wet snowfall.

President Coolidge, Grant testified, has refused to approve appropriations of \$200,000 for remedying conditions, despite the fact that the roof becomes more dangerous each year.

"The president," said Grant, "does not see how he can get away for a long enough time to make the roof safe to be taken down and replaced."

Some of the danger, Grant said, was reduced last winter by the removal of an electric water tank.

And coincident with this is the more important announcement, so far as the press of the state is concerned, into the publishing business; that it will issue an office. No newspaper was asked to bid upon the publication of the magazine.

Yet the Idaho Home Industries association has been demanding and receiving space in the press of this state, which, if charged for at regular rates, it could not possibly pay.

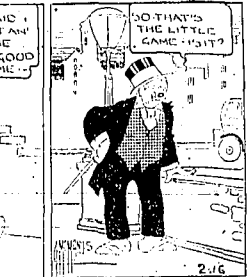

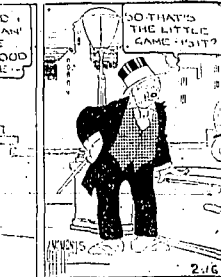

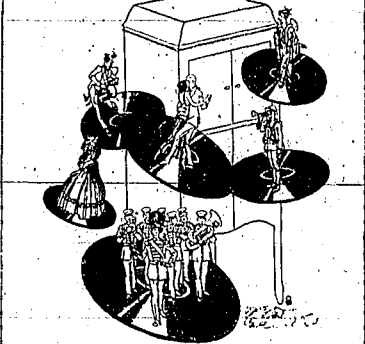
