Idaho Cities Are Invited to Send Teams to Gooding College for Trophy Contest Next Month.

WESLEYAN, Idaho, Feb. 22.—Coach C. L. Buckner, taking advantage of the fact that Gooding college is located just half way between Idaho and Nevada on the main line of the Union Pacific system, has invited all Southern Idaho high school teams to participate in a basketball tournament to be held at the college gymnasium March 12 and 13.

To be eligible to play in this tournament, the players must be residents of the town bearing the name of the team, employed by the business or commercial enterprise, or employed in the institution or school from which they come, and not registered in any high school at any time during the school year of 1939-40.

Each team may have ten members, of which fifteen will be eligible for drawing for the games will be conducted by the Gooding Leader, March 4, with the agreement that no team will be permitted to play more than four times in the same day.

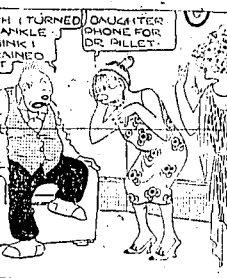
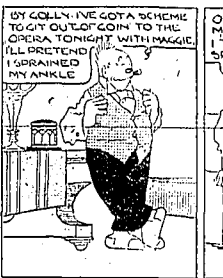

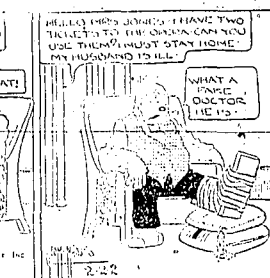
