COOLIDGE IS WHIPPED IN RING MATCH

AMHSTER, Mass., Feb. 21.—John Coolidge, fighting as a lightweight, went down to defeat before the flying fist of Matt Silverman, Brooklyn, in the annual boxing tournament here. The president's son was making his first appearance in the ring.

Although John lost the decision on points he was given a "moral victory" by his friends, due to the fact that he stood up when many would have quit.

Matt came back at him with both fists, concentrating on Coolidge's nose. Coolidge's right arm could not reach the flying fist of his opponent.
