Every young man needs this training. He also needs the physical development that goes with the training.

The woman was excluded rightly and the country is not in accord with the caricaturing of liberal press. This is a clean country and we have no place for this class of women. To sustain them means to let down the bars of our own high standards. We have just as much right to bar one who offends with her body as one who offends with her tongue. Exchange.

People have reduced but they have also paid the penalty. All the nostrums in the world cannot keep a fat man lean if it is in his blood. The only thing to do is to accept flesh as a part of life, live frugally and eat sensibly. Diet is the one way to control flesh. Patent remedies are injurious and cause many deaths. Some people never ought to reduce, others should reduce in part but right food will keep nearly everybody in normal condition. It is not such a terrible thing to be fat even for a woman. We exaggerate the heinousness of being fleshy. The flesh is not nearly so dangerous as the instruments used to reduce.

THE FARMERS' PAY

For a long time the farmers were led to believe that they actually benefited by the speculation in grain. They were being victimized all the while. The gamblers make the profits. The sensational rises came after the farmers have disposed of their wheat.

Speculations where millions of bushels of wheat are sold every day without a bushel being diverted is one of the rotten spots in our government. We have improved our housing, have cleaned up many of the cesspools of vice but we have not reached the men who live off our wheat crop who do not see a bushel from year to year.

Legislation has failed to reach these men because they are smart and have always found a way to beat every rule or law. But there must be a reckoning. It is so unfair to let these leeches live without producing, to let them suck the life blood of agriculture, that the demand for drastic regulations is imperative. Senator Capper of Kansas, is after the gamblers but he has been after them before. He has earnestly striven to put them out of business but they have always found a loophole which gave them air to breathe and live. Something must be done.—State Journal.

SIMPLIFIED GOVERNMENT

In New York there is a movement to simplify the state government. New Jersey already has this simplified form in part. Other states must follow. It will not be accepted that the state must absorb all that is saved by economies in the federal government. In New York an effort is being made to displace 180 bogards and commissions with 16. This is hard to accomplish because of the up-ramp the occupants of the commissions will make and the stir they will get their friends to make as well. But it is right and if we are to have state economy we will be forced to have a simplified government.

Idaho does not have an extended government as some states but we have entirely too much as it is. There can be a saving of millions by reducing the responsibility with definite heads. Until this is done there can be no appreciable savings.

Pocatello has a simplified government but it will not be able to function entirely until we get a city manager form. Of course this is not so much needed while a business man like Ben-Ross is mayor but it would enable us to lessen expense and get more for our expenditures.—Idaho State Journal.

The Pocatello morning republican paper shows commendable degree of non-partisan spirit in praising the democratic mayor of the Gate City. Regarding simplified government in Idaho, Governor D. W. Davis in his first message after election advocated the submission of a constitutional provision for a short ballot system to the voters of the state and recommended legislation subsidiary to and apparently depending on this constitutional change. The legislature ditched the proposed submission of a constitutional change which would have laid the foundation for real simplification and instead passed the cabinet form bill, which made confusion worse confounding, and Davis signed the bill and forgot his original suggestion.

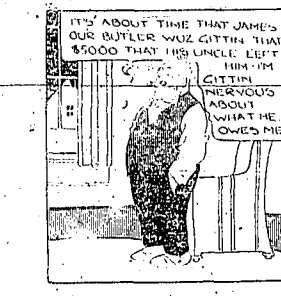

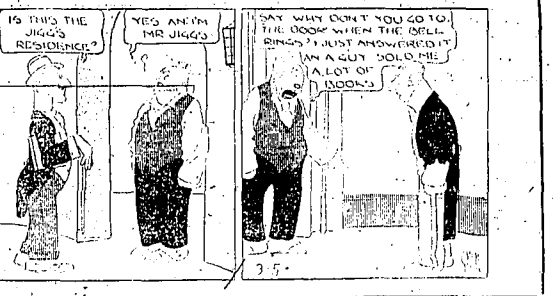
