David Starr Jordan, speaking of the death of Luther Burbank, says: "He was in common with scientific men in general, convinced that all knowledge arises from the mind." Very well, David, but whence the mind? Scientific men, likewise, agree that something cannot come out of nothing. The intellect can not evolve out of nothing, not even out of that which does not contain at least as much as that which is evolved. "We older veterans, since the world war, have looked upon the younger veterans of the American Legion as kindred and our logical heirs and successors, and they have given evidence of their willingness and ability to take up our work as we are compelled to lay it down.

"We feel that it is better that that which we have to leave to our successors should be given to them as a voluntary act on our part, rather than that should be required to work until the last survivor of the Grand Army in Twin Falls has passed from the scene of action. In this we want to make it plain to the younger veterans that we are willing that they should continue with our work, and that we have full confidence in their purpose and ability to carry on to the spirit that has always prompted patriotic Americans to action in the nation's defense."

The Farmers Speak!

Up to the present time, enough beets have not been signed up to insure the operation of the sugar factories at Twin Falls, Burley and Paul.

The recent cold snap with moisture that has followed, has the earmarks of a sugar beet year. The moisture that is falling all over the United States betokens an enormous acreage and yield of wheat, beans, potatoes, and in our opinion sugar beets look like a good crop this year.

We are asking the Sugar Company for better contracts, and usually consider our duty done when this is accomplished. Do you not consider that when the contract is settled, we should keep faith with the Sugar Company, and give them beets enough to run their factories, to a normal capacity at least?

When you stop to consider the benefits derived from the by-products which bring in live stock to consume our hay, also what it means to the dairymen, the fertilizer produced to build up the land and the known fact that you get larger yields from all crops grown when sugar beets are grown as a rotation, together with the amount of money distributed in the community and the help that is shipped in, which enables us to take care of all our other crops, we urge you all to increase your beet acreage. If you have the land, and if you have not already decided to plant beets, to change your plans, cut out a few acres of corn, beans or potatoes.

Let us get together and see that our local factories run the coming fall.

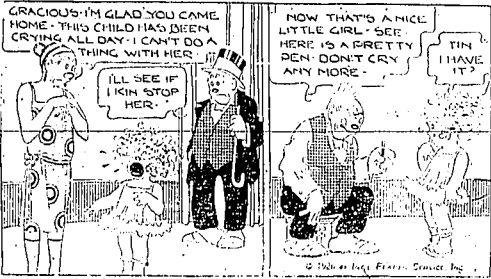

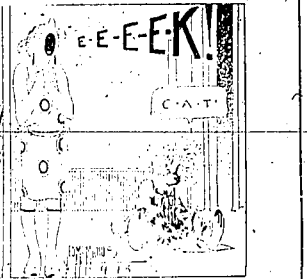
