WOMAN IS BACKBONE OF NATION

President of State W. C. T. U. Declares That Woman Is Needed by World in Inspiring Address at District Meeting Here Today; Straw Vote Not Indicative of People's View, point She Declares; Program Is Interesting.

"Women, the World Needs You" was the theme of the main address this afternoon, of Mrs. J. Brady of Peotocello, state president of the Women's Christian Temperance Union, at the regular meeting of the organization, in session at the Methodist church.

"Woman is the backbone of the nation," said Mrs. Brady. "We them success in the only view they behold in the distance, Mrs. Henry Ward Beecher, the dry reformer. In seeing at Washington, she sees that we stand for no modification of the Volstead act; but rather that it be strengthened."

Duty of Women Citizens. "You should know the law, what is permitted and what is prohibited; how to find out who is punished and how to see whether punishment is prompt or arbitrary. You should be prepared to answer objections to prohibition, and know what it has accomplished. Nomination of dry candidates should be urged, study clubs should be organized, and friends of prohibition should be invited to lecture and vote."

Brady Did Not Vote. Mrs. Brady emphasized the fact that in the recent newspaper poll, the friends of prohibition did not win. In her conclusion she advised a letter to her local Congressman, T. Smith, in which she said: "There is no reason why 'dry' should vote on a straw ballot when they are already satisfied with existing conditions; only the drys should be allowed to vote."
