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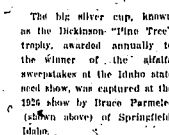
CALF CLUBS ARE TO BE ORGANIZED

THE OBJECTIVES OF SCOUTING

The real purpose of the Boy Scout movement is character building and citizenship training. Its uniqueness is in that a program of wholesome outdoor activities has been developed in such definite form and under such conditions as create a desire on the part of normal boys to be scouts. In accordance with the ability and training of the leadership available this program of activities, together with the opportunity for hiking and camping, form the basis for making the Scout Oath and Law and the ideals of service through the Daily Good Turn effective in the lives of boys.

The individual, patrol, troops and community good turns furnish the most effective means of developing and strengthening the character of boys individually, instilling ideals of service and giving them an attitude of mind towards the community and organized society that insure their being active "participating citizens." The more or less dramatic community service as well as national campaigns of service such as the Liberty Loan, and "Get Out the Vote" were primarily of interest to the leaders, in Scouting because of their educational value in giving boys a consciousness of their relationship to organized society and the right attitude of mind.

With the aid of the uniform, capitalizing to the fullest extent the aid of doors, and with the patrol of six or eight as the unit of organization, the Scout program has been carried out on a basis of learning by doing in such a way as to have earned the commendation of the leaders in the field of education the world over. The whole atmosphere of the life of the school in that the Scout is placed in the position where, in accordance with his desires, he can go forward in the program of activities and service in a genuine, voluntary way under conditions which develop his initiative and resourcefulness and strengthen his character.

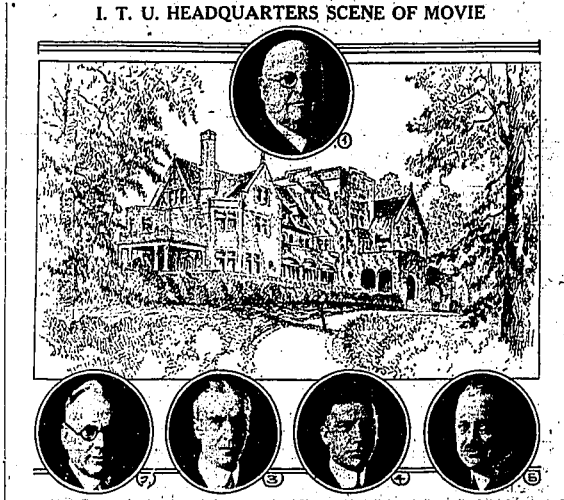

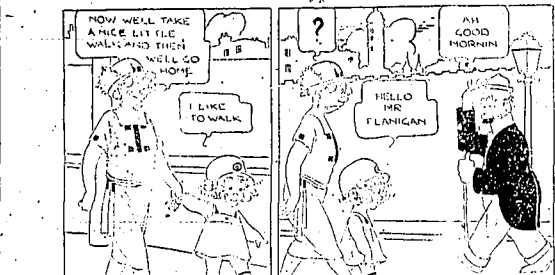
