COST GROWTH FOR COUNTY IS \$30,000

Comparison of Annual Report Just Printed with That of Previous Year Shows Increase in Expenses in Most Departments; Hospital Maintenance Gets Biggest Boost.

Heavy increases in appropriations for most of the county departments totaling more than \$20,000 are shown by a comparison of the annual report of Twin Falls county for the year ending January 10, 1926, with the report for the year ending January 10, 1925, when the percent of bondholders took their share.

The increase in the office of treasurer was about \$10,000, from \$37,004.45 to \$47,004.45. The increase for the assessor was about \$10,000, from \$10,308.38 to \$20,308.37.

The expense of the office of the sheriff showed a decrease of altho' the salary from \$12,525.42 to \$12,505.42 for the conduct of his office.

The increase in the cost of the office of the prosecutor was slightly less than \$500, or \$252.60, to \$1,820.55.

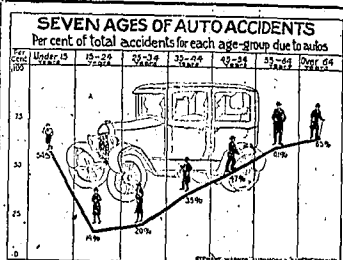
