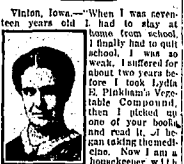

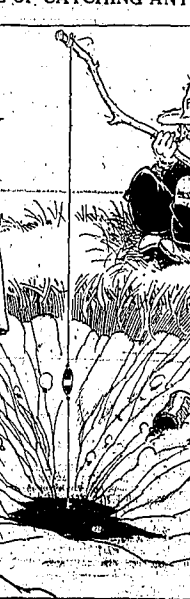

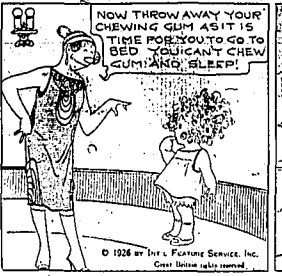

ANNUAL AUDIT SUPPLEMENT IS ON FILE

Comments, Criticisms and Recommendations Are Made in Full Report of Auditor Which Was Received by Board Tuesday; Strong Collecting Urged, Methods of Taking Inventories Are Censured and Suggestions Made.

Having heard the presentation of the new report for waterworks, the Salmon street, the Twin Falls cant board yesterday afternoon took up the completed audit report which other items of routine business. The auditing committee requested of the board the report of work some weeks ago, a summary of which was published in the Times on April 25. This did not contain the explanations elucidating the facts from the viewpoint of the auditor, and showing up conditions that would show how the board was to be held on some of the existing conditions. The full report yesterday contained such interpretation.

A complete budget had been submitted yesterday to the same board of the Twin Falls Cant company, by Edwin A. Wilson, auditor company.

The difficulties in carrying out budget system under conditions presented with the affecting transactions and other elements of cost factors have lack of control is given consideration.

It is advised that the expense budget be divided into three main sections: that expenditures in each case should be carefully estimated and not assessed at it, and that an accurate representation of expenses more or less. They very accurate estimates can be made through reports of regular that it is necessary to make a record maintained, before they are placed in the budget.

Due to the magnitude of the system, and the amount of work constantly and enough free cash hand, it is necessary to keep an account which should be excluded from the budget. It is advised that the material and cash will be available as needed should collection not produce cash enough to meet the budget as needed. The possibility of depending too much on anticipated revenue from accounts receivable and from many miscellaneous sources of revenue is pointed out.

No Iron Fall Rule. So far as approval of purchases and bills are concerned, the report suggests that no iron fall rule could be adopted which would be workable without almost constant attention of the board. It is stated that if purchases are unrestricted the goods bought might not be paid for. A plan for checking is suggested. It is stated that one of the most vital controls the board has over expenditures is in the preparation of the budget. Every item of cash expense should be entered into it. It is stated.

Discussion of probable needs and methods of covering them are urged for all meetings, or that the board will be familiar with bills when presented. So far as possible the board should approve purchases when bills are made, but because the board cannot always be in session and because unexpected expenses may occur, this cannot be made 100 per cent efficient, the report suggests that a short illustrating suggestion be set out.
