In summer the air is so dry that a blanket soaked in water and hung on a line will be totally dry in half an hour. A man must drink as often as every half hour to keep alive. At Furnace Creek ranch the bees wade in the brackish ditch and swim in the water. The coral-encrusted crabs, snails and horses has been found on the ice in 1850. 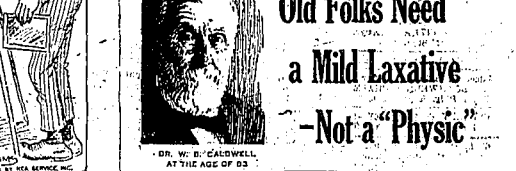

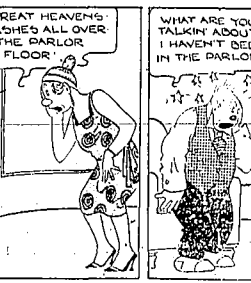
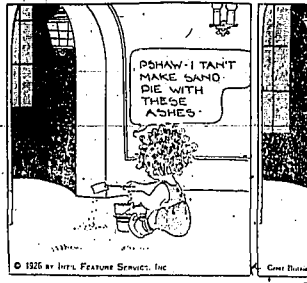

POTATO DEAL CAUSES SUIT NOW ON TRIAL

John W. Harlin Suits J. W. Harlin Repleaded, Contract Will Harlin Suits Johnson Is to Blame Action Involves \$2500.

Action in which the parties are \$237.29 apiece is before the district court today. O. J. Johnson, represented by Foster & Whelan, claims that John W. Harlin owes him \$2025 for failure to deliver potatoes, according to contract, while Harlin, represented by Stephen & North, claims that Johnson broke the contract and that he was defendant \$202.50.

Facts agreed on are that Johnson bought 12 acres of potatoes from Harlin at \$150 per hundred about October 11, and that the quantity should be free from cuts and sunburn; also that on October 23 or 24, Harlin notified Johnson that he would deliver no more but had sent another party before this Harlin had delivered about 12,000 pounds of potatoes. Johnson claims that potatoes delivered in price between that time and the time the contract was made and the time it was declared off. Johnson paid Harlin \$300 when the contract was made.

ARTESIAN WATER SUIT IS SUSTAINED

Word had just been received by Walters & Parry, attorneys for the plaintiff, that Judge T. Bailey Lee has decided in favor of the Artesian Water company in a novel suit involving the artesian wells at Ardenham City. The Artesian Water company is the owner of a group of artesian wells drilled by J. E. Rowe over twenty years since. In the summer of 1925 D. H. Moorhead of this city drilled an artesian well near the fence line of the Artesian Water company's property and began to pump water from this new well. The Artesian Water company brought an action against Mr. Moorhead and the owners of his well to enjoin them from operating the new well, under the claim that the new well took away part of the flow of water from the old wells.

According to the opinion just received, Judge Lee decided, after two hearings, that this new well did deplete the flow of the old wells, and has enjoined the operation of the new well, except only on the condition that the owners of this new well must at all times return to the Artesian Water company, enough water so that the flow from the wells shall be kept the same as it was before Moorhead drilled his well.

This case has been considered.
