# Partial Expenditures Of Candidates Nearly \$750,000 it Is Said

### Senate Probe Committee Lists Alleged Expense Amounts in Pennsylvania Primary Campaign Aggregating \$697,000.

WASHINGTON, June 11.—Witnesses summoned by the senate primary investigating committee today showed that partial expenditures in the Pennsylvania republican primary amounted to about three-quarters of a million dollars.

This witness, who submitted the figures, said, in any fraction of total expenditures.

Here are the amounts authorized:

Senator George Wharton Pepper, personal complete expenses (not connected with the Pepper-Fisher ticket expense), \$125,000.

W. L. Mellon, nephew of the secretary of the treasury, expenses in 20 counties in the western part of the state for Pepper, \$200,000.

William G. Ware, successful candidate, submitted personal expenses of \$211,000 in the committee although he had not yet taken the oath.

P. S. Staehlecker, secretary to Governor Pinchot, said \$150,000 had been spent in all for Pinchot.

This made the total authorized expenditure at \$697,000.

Senator Truman H. Newberry of Michigan was forbidden to report to the senate after he had submitted expenditures of about \$150,000 in a primary campaign several years ago.

### Child Shouts 'Blackland' at Brooklyn School and Children Storm Doors; Two Severely Injured.

HOBOKEN, N. J., June 11.—A small boy shouted "blackland" probably as a hot remark to some teacher in front of a school attended largely by Italians here today and precipitated a panic which spread through the hundreds of children at the school and then around the neighborhood and finally required strenuous efforts by police to quell it.

Two children were so severely hurt they were taken to hospitals and others were knocked down and bruised, including first aid treatment.

The children were entering the building for classes when the cry of "blackland" came from the street. The cry was taken up by hundreds of children. Those still outside began to run and cry for their mothers and friends. The lines of children inside the building stopped moving as they took up the cry. Then they turned toward the doors.

In a moment they were shouting, shouting and fleeing to escape. Teachers, attempting to quiet them, were burned aside. One lay flat on a sidewalk and was trampled and killed.

# WORLD FAMINE IS PREDICTED

### Washington Meteorologist Sees Gigantic Crop Shortage in 'Year Without Summer'

By RICHARD G. HARVARD  
CHICAGO, June 11.—Prediction of the severe weather conditions of the "Year Without Summer" in 1927 and in the present remains a possibility will threaten a world famine according to Herbert Bowen, Washington meteorologist.

"We are entering upon a period of catalytic changes in climate," Bowen told the United Press. "Already New England's weather there was some in Virginia and New Jersey, and in Maryland, resulting from the rush of polar ice from New England bank."

Bowen is a pioneer in long range forecasting. Although the scientific accuracy of his methods are questioned by some meteorologists and by the weather bureau officials, he also is the author of many predictions, which is based on rather rational and sound European countries are preparing for the impending crop failure, said Bowen.
