(Why scrap) so much, brethren, your ticket will no special dispensation or right of way in the general election and the chances are that the majority of the people do not agree with your method of conducting county affairs anyway.

CHANGING THE BRIDGE FRANCHISE

If the bridge franchise is to be changed why not open the proposition up to all bidders alike? The present franchise was submitted and accepted by one bidder and this eliminated the other and we do not believe it is fair to the other bidder to change the conditions without allowing him to say whether he would like to have the contract under the new terms. Some peculiar conditions are set up by people in positions of trust.

In the second place we are not sure but this special privilege granted the holders of the franchise may prove to be illegal. Several legal authorities have expressed this idea in discussing the matter this morning without going into detail as to what opinion. The very idea of a franchise is that all bidders may come before the two boards and submit their propositions, but if after this franchise is granted then the lucky bidder is allowed to change it to suit his pleasure where will the public get any sort of justice? In other words, if this term of years can be raised to ten why can it not at the end of that time be extended again to fifty years or even indefinitely. If we understand this franchise at all it is an agreement between the grantor and the grantee on a contract which involves the public funds. Therefore every taxpayer is interested in this change of an agreement which was definitely and precisely settled at a public hearing and said terms agreed on. The majority felt that the Dravo bid was the most favorable as to tolls at the time the franchise was granted but a small differential would be overlooked, but if these rates are to be the foothold of future changes and negotiations, then the public will demand that the only fair proposition is to re-open the matter for old and new bidders.

The attorney for Twin Falls county has refused to give an opinion on the proposed changes at this time, but will withhold the matter for further consideration. The Union Bridge company claims that this substitution is not a vital factor in this contract but we contend that it is and the contract between the two parties is thus nullified if we understand the issues correctly. Public opinion does not approve this change as evidenced by the remarks of prominent business and professional men up and down the street this morning. Many people who stood out for the commissioners and the franchise holder have now begun to suspect something.

WHO PAYS THESE HUGE CAMPAIGN BILLS?

What is the interest of individuals who give large sums of money to campaign funds? Is it just an interest in the particular political doctrine of the party taking up the collection? That interest probably doesn't account for the millions poured into the Pennsylvania primary; and there, after a while, pretty strong intimations that the large contributors to the funds expected to get their money back and a profit besides.

If, indeed, political contributions are not gifts but investments, who ultimately pays the bill? Suppose a political organization by the large use of money contributed to it (or invested in it) by its supporters is able to capture the government of a city or a state. Say the government has big contracts for public work to give out. Say these contracts go to the individuals, firms or interests that supplied the campaign funds of the party that captured the government. Is it difficult to see, in that case, who pays the election bills?

To get the connection read the following from the Philadelphia Record: "Under Philadelphia's political system city inspectors engaged in checking up on the performance of public works are usually appointed at the instance of the contractor holders or of their intimate political associates. When a chummy relation exists between city contractors and city inspectors it is not surprising that contractors are able to slight their work and cheat the taxpayers."

The taxpayer is the real angel who digs up the huge campaign fund of which we are hearing so much.

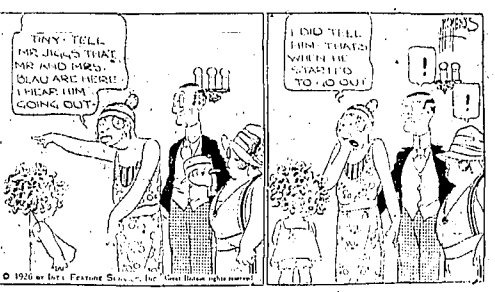
