At 11 a. m. the Seminole was off St. Augustine and the center of the wave swept westward from Miami and Jupiter with the gale making northward.

LET'S GET THE BRIDGE NOW

Now that the new bonds for the bridge have been filed in Jerome and certified copies put on record here, it is to be assumed that the structure will be erected.

Two things are needed in behalf of the county: One that a correct and accurate check be made on the cost of the structure. Lawyers consulted by the bridge construction company are quoted as saying that the public utilities commission has now power without special legislation to regulate tolls.

The second assurance needed is that there shall be no further extensions and amendments. Time enough has been lost. This is a matter of interest on both sides of the river.

Recent official action regarding the proposed rim-rock Snake river canyon bridge by the boards of county commissioners of Twin Falls and Jerome counties has aroused considerable interest.

Now, in July, six months later, with nothing at all done regarding the building of the bridge, this franchise is "amended."

The layman would understand this better if the word "juggle" instead of the word "amend" were used. As to the legal gentlemen, none of them have anything to say.

NOTE AT PRIMARIES BY JAMES D. WHELAN.

It is just as much your duty to vote in your party primaries as it is to vote at the general election. If the members of all parties would vote honestly at the primary elections, the best in each party would be nominated.

The Idaho primary law is in some ways a bad one, principally because it does not extend far enough and does not include state and congressional offices and because it prohibits the printing of the same name on two ballots.

The law says: "No person shall be entitled to vote at any primary election unless he is duly registered in the precinct wherein he offers to vote, and is a member of the political party holding the primary at which he attempts to vote."

There are some precincts in this country in which no candidates for delegates have been filed on the democratic ticket, and there are a great many precincts in which progressive candidates have not been filed.

Right now there is a wave of pseudo reform sweeping through the republican managerial ranks, largely engineered by those who have not heretofore been especially

HEAT EXHAUSTION—COMMON ILLNESS

By JOHN WYCKOFF, M. D., CHICAGO, July 25.—Heat exhaustion is the commonest form of illness resulting from individuals being subjected to high temperatures, for long periods of time.

The symptoms begin with a feeling of dizziness and faintness, followed by nausea and vomiting. The person loses consciousness. Externally the body is cold and clammy. The temperature is low normal.

One of the most serious conditions on record is heat stroke. In this case the person is usually brought on by direct exposure to the sun's rays in extremely hot weather, particularly if the person is exposed for a long period of time.

Wear clothing of light texture to aid the perspiration to evaporate freely, and of light color to reflect the sun's rays instead of absorbing them. Wear clothing as loose as possible, particularly about the neck, so as to avoid interference with the circulation.
