

GREEN IS FIRED

The suspension of Col. Ned M. Green, prohibition administrator for California and Nevada, which came yesterday after Green had admitted entertaining his friends with confiscated liquor is another instance of the gigantic problem this country faces in trying to enforce the pro-hibition law. Here was a man holding supreme authority over a large area in the matter of prohibition enforcement violating the law openly and even bragging about it. He declared he was no prude, but if he felt that way he should have resigned long before his actions forced, his suspension. If his views of prohibition did not coincide with the law he had no right to take the very responsible position

Taw he had no right to take the very responsible position he held.

We hold no brief for violators of the prohibition law and we agree with Col. Green when he declares that several of the men who are investigating his conduct are probably just as guilty as he is in the matter of drinking illicit liquor. The American people, up until the time of prohibition, were not accustomed to seeing the laws of his country violated at every turn. They insisted that the laws be obeyed and punished offenders willingly and quickly.

Today the government not only has to try to enforce the prohibition law, but it has to do it through a depart-

the prohibition law, but it has to do it through a department that is manned by political appointees selected for the job, not because of superior or average qualifications,

but for political service.

It was Col. Green who appeared not long ago to Pres It was con Green who appeared not ong ago to res-ident Coolinge for authority to use state and county offi-cers in California for prohibition enforcement. He away given the order by the president, but it raised such a storm of protest that nothing came of it. While making the re-quest, Col. Green, by his own confession, was violating his eath of office and showing his friends a good time at the expense of the government.—Nevada State Journal.
