From there these men will go out to various fields of activity and do their utmost to inspire other men to get into this work for the improvement of the boy. No greater work is open to the men of America today than having a part in making better citizens out of the rising generation. Twin Falls county and Southern Idaho are identified with this scouting program in a very definite way and the citizens of Twin Falls and Southern Idaho contribute of their time and energy and also of their cash to make this movement a success. No sacrifice is too great when you consider the results that are possible. If your effort or your dollar should keep one boy from going wrong what a blessing this project would be to this community.

FIRE PREVENTION WEEK

For a number of years Fire Prevention week has been observed throughout this nation and the U. S. forestry service has made considerable of this educational program. It is worth thinking about and whether you have had a severe loss recently or not does not matter so much but we have all read and heard of the terrible ravages of fire and we should join this week which is to be observed from the third to the ninth of this month. This idea should not only be celebrated now but should be observed throughout the 365 days of the year.

Here are some facts compiled on this subject by the forestry department if we are not mistaken as to the source:

During 1925 the fire loss in America was \$662,751,046, which is a large sum of money. It is an increase of nearly \$14,000,000 over 1924 and 1924 was a large increase over 1923.

Most appalling of all, however, is the twenty thousand lives which are sacrificed to the fire god each year.

Many of the fires are preventable. In an effort to reduce the fire loss all may have a part. H. W. Herman, local fire insurance agent, has called out attention to a list of "don'ts" that will go far in preventing fires if they are observed.

Keep matches in metal boxes where children cannot reach them.

Don't keep ashes in wooden boxes or deposit them against wooden buildings or partitions.

Don't change your electric wiring without consulting a competent electrician.

Don't hang electric light cords on nails.

Be careful with electric that irons and always use with signal light.

Use metal protection under all stoves and protect work where stoves or furnaces are close to walls.

Don't use stove pipes through ceilings, roofs or wooden partitions.

Have all flues cleaned, examined and repaired at least once each year.

Every open fire place should have a screen.

Don't connect gas stoves, heaters or hot plates with rubber hose.

Don't use gasoline or benzine to cleanse clothing near an open flame, light or fire. Use non-inflammable cleaner.

Don't use kerosene, benzine or naphtha in lighting fires or to quicken a slow fire.

Don't use liquid jolishes near open lights. Many such compounds contain volatile inflammable oils.

Don't go into closets with lighted matches or candles.

Remember that there is always danger in the discarded cigarette and cigar stub.

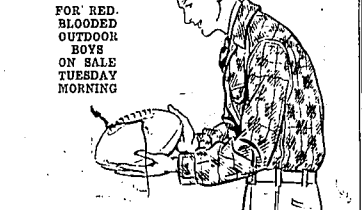

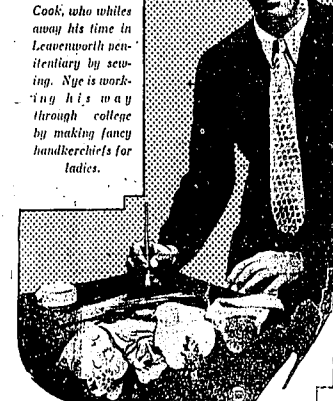

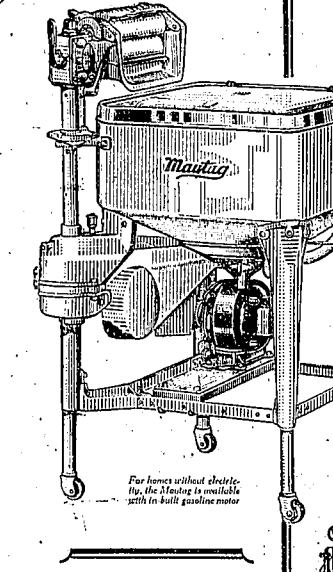
